She is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Colorado/Health Sciences and oversees the Community Medicine Rotation for Southern Colorado Family Medicine Residency Program. She also mentors pre medicine students and has a special interest in assisting rural students in getting accepted to medical school.

Dr. Nevin-Woods has a special interest in tobacco control and prevention, teen pregnancy prevention, international travel medicine, disease prevention/health promotion, and child abuse prevention.
