Madeleine Solomon, MPH, is Director, Policy and Community Programs at the Tobacco Technical Assistance Consortium (TTAC) at Emory University's Rollins School of Public Health. She also serves as policy advisor to the Tobacco Control Network. Madeleine is an authority on tobacco policy development, having provided training and technical assistance in 42 states, many local communities across the U.S, and recently in Beijing and Suzhou in the Peoples Republic of China. Her work focuses on policy interventions that are proven to reduce tobacco use, including smoke-free air policies, excise tax increases; and developing strong tobacco control programs based on CDC recommendations. Madeleine began her national work at the American Medical Association as a grant officer for the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's SmokeLess States Program. She provided training and technical assistance to states around the US who received grants to change tobacco policies in the first major tobacco policy initiative in the US. Madeleine served as the American Heart Association's national lead on tobacco issues for all 50 states and headed the DC-based tobacco team on federal policy. She took the lead in the development of a guide entitled, "Preventing, Preparing for and Transforming Conflict: A Higher Ground Approach for Tobacco Control Coalitions," as well as in leadership development programs at the Advocacy Institute in Washington, DC. Madeleine organized the first policy program in the American Heart Association, served as a lobbyist in the Illinois Legislature, and as the director of the tobacco coalition in Illinois. Madeleine received her Masters in Public Health from the University of Illinois School of Public Health. Madeleine resides in Highland Park, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago.
