

LCDR CHRISTINE WEST, RN, MSN/MPH

Lieutenant Commander Christine West of the United States Public Health Service (USPHS) is a nurse epidemiologist assigned to the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) in the Division of Surveillance, Hazard Evaluations, and Field Studies. She conducts health hazard evaluations across the country to determine if workers are exposed to hazardous materials or harmful conditions and provides recommendations to protect their health and safety. During her career with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), NIOSH, and USPHS starting in July 2004, LCDR West completed a two-year fellowship with the Epidemic Intelligence Service, has completed numerous health hazard evaluations, four of which were large-scale epidemiologic studies, published five peer-reviewed journal articles, and has presented at several national conferences. She received a dual Masters Degrees in Community Health Nursing and Public Health and Bachelors in Nursing from Johns Hopkins University. She worked as a registered nurse with the Johns Hopkins Hospital for 4 years in an orthopedic / trauma unit from 2000-2004. LCDR West served in the U.S. Peace Corps in Malawi, Africa where she worked on child survival projects from 1996-1998.
