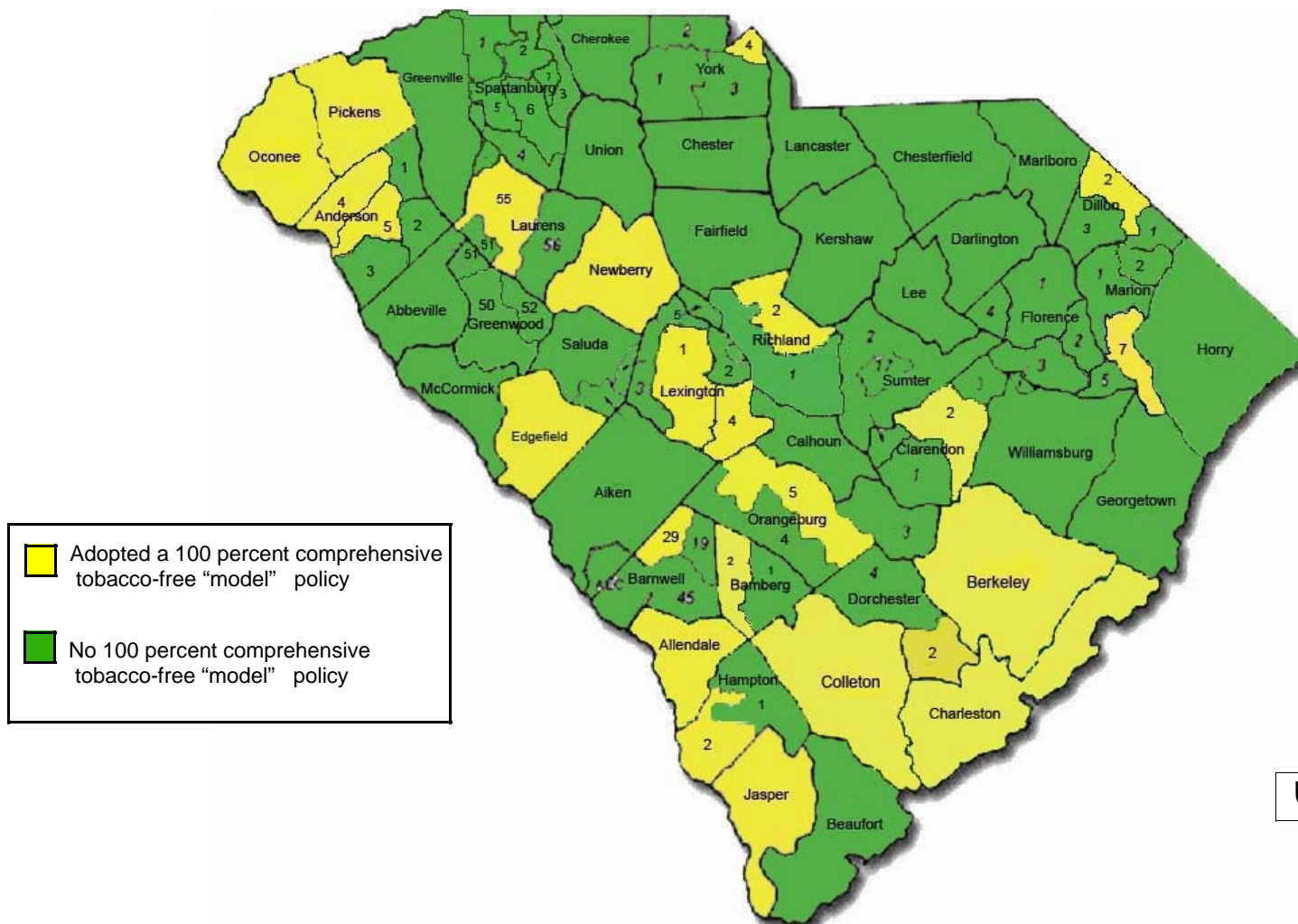

Updated February 1, 2010

The 100 percent comprehensive tobacco-free "model" policy endorsed by the S.C. School Boards Association and the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control includes the following key components:

- 1) Prohibits tobacco use on school property at all times by all people;
- 2) Offers proven and effective science-based tobacco prevention education;
- 3) Provides referrals to cessation programs;
- 4) Includes procedures for enforcement; and
- 5) Prohibits tobacco industry advertising and sponsorship.

***ALL** components must be included in a district's written policy for the district to be considered "100 percent tobacco-free" by the S.C. School Boards Association and S.C. DHEC.
