



Being a bartender is not a crime... it shouldn't carry the death penalty.



People routinely exposed to second-hand smoke – such as restaurant, bar, bingo and pool halls workers – can see their risk of lung cancer triple.

The Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act lists 15 substances that have no safe level of exposure – 6 of which are found in tobacco smoke. Current by-laws restrict smoking in Kingston workplaces – except in restaurants, bars, bingo and pool halls.

A 100 percent smoke-free spaces by-law would bring Kingston in line with other Ontario municipalities, like **Ottawa, Cornwall, Belleville, Guelph, Oakville, Orillia, and Waterloo.** Shouldn't Kingston workers have the same protection?

Until all Kingston workplaces – including restaurants, bars, pool and bingo halls – are completely smoke-free, lung cancer and heart disease will continue to be job hazards for workers. It's time to decide.
