<u>Using Retailer AVCs as a Tool in Tobacco Control</u> – *TCLC*. The Tobacco Control Legal Consortium published a fact sheet on the potential for multi-state tobacco regulation using Assurance of Voluntary Compliance (AVCs). Tobacco advertising can be limited through AVCs which are legal agreements between an attorney general and a retailer such as a supermarket, pharmacy or gas station.

State News

Hawaii Raises Smoking Age from 18 to 21. (HI) Governor David Ige signed a bill making Hawaii the first state to prohibit the sale of tobacco products to anyone under 21 effective January 1, 2016. The Institute of Medicine recently published a report indicating that raising the minimum legal age to 21 could reduce smoking initiation of young adults. This new policy has the potential to significantly decrease smoking rates in Hawaii since 86% of current adult smokers in the state started before the age of 21.

New York's Smoking Rates Reduced to Lowest Levels in Recorded History. (NY) New data shows the adult smoking rate in NY is at 14.5%, considerably lower than the national average of 17.8%. In addition, the smoking rate for high school students is at 7.3%, showing an improvement of 42% in the last four years. New York State Health Commissioner Dr. Howard Zucker said, "Thanks to New York State's aggressive and multi-faceted cessation efforts, our smoking rates have shrunk to their lowest levels in recorded history."

In the News

Half of Cancer Mortalities Associated with Tobacco Use – Reuters.

New research published in JAMA Internal Medicine is confirming the link between cancer and tobacco use and the importance for effective smoking cessation tools for cancer patients. A new study conducted by the American Cancer Society found that approximately 50% of deaths of the 12 cancers most commonly associated with smoking, such as lung and esophageal, are directly linked to smoking. A second study concluded that lung cancer patients provided with tobacco cessation resources are 40% more successful at quitting.

Pregnant Women are Unaware of the Potential Risks of Using Ecigarettes. - Reuters. A small survey found that 57% of pregnant participants were not aware that e-cigarettes contain nicotine, and 43% believed e-cigarettes are safer for their fetus than traditional tobacco products. Despite the limitations of this study it indicates the need to increase awareness of the potential health risks associated with e-cigarette use during pregnancy

Research

Is There a Relationship Between the Concentration of Same-Sex Couples and Tobacco Retailer Density? – Oxford. **Key Findings**: A higher density of tobacco retailers were found in communities with more same-sex couples. Communities with higher rates of same-sex couples also had higher rates of low income and minority residents.

Currently no states have a comprehensive tobacco tax resulting in illicit tobacco trade and lost state revenue. Comprehensive tobacco taxes including high-tech tax stamps, stamping all tobacco products and agreements with tribes could help enforce tobacco sale regulations.

The Impact of Prenatal Tobacco Smoking on Risk of Diabetes

Mellitus in Middle-Aged Women- Journal of Developmental Origins
of Health and Disease. **Key Findings:** A prospective study showed
smoking during early pregnancy is associated with higher rates of
diabetes mellitus and type two diabetes in adult daughters.

Global Statistics on Addictive Behaviors: 2014 Status Report -

Addiction. **Key Findings:** A comprehensive report on the prevalence and harms of drugs in the world, found that alcohol and tobacco are the most prevalent and harmful addictions. Data indicates 22.5% of the world or about 1 billion people smoke tobacco, and 11% of male deaths and 6% of female deaths are due to tobacco use.
