Help Your Peers

These are the current circulating Help Your Peers requests.

Enforcement of Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS) Youth Sales Restrictions

Deadline: May 14, 2015

Vermont is one of many states that bans the sale of electronic nicotine delivery systems (tobacco substitutes in our statute) to minors. However, we do not have additional funding or staff to add tobacco substitute compliance checks, and our state inspections count toward our Synar and FDA requirements. In addition, Vermont does not define ENDS as tobacco products, so the enforcement of such is not part of our Synar checks. Have other states successfully integrated ENDS into their Synar program requirements or FDA inspection program? <u>The FDA Science Forum</u> – FDA May 27-28, 2015; *Register by May 15th.*

State Medicaid Coverage for Individual Counseling for Parents during Pediatrician Visits

Deadline: May 19, 2015

The Vermont Department of Health's Tobacco Program is seeking information regarding state Medicaid coverage for individual counseling -- for pediatrician use in counseling the (Medicaid beneficiary) partners of their patients.

During the first two years of a baby's life, there are several well-child visits providing ample opportunity to educate and promote quitting with parents/caregivers. Vermont Medicaid approved use of individual and group counseling codes with Medicaid beneficiaries beginning January 2014.

Partner Announcements

Legacy Provides Grants to U.S. Public Community Colleges to Support Smoke- and Tobacco-Free Campus

Policies – Legacy. Legacy is offering grants to public community colleges across the country to support efforts to advocate for, adopt, and implement a 100% smoke-free or 100% tobacco-free policy. Grants are \$5,000/year, with up to two years of funding. Applications are due on August 6, 2015.

<u>FDA Announcements</u> – *FDA*. The FDA Center for Tobacco Products denied a Citizen Petition from R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company and American Snuff Company, LLC to change a smokeless tobacco warning statement. FDA also issued a <u>draft</u> <u>guidance</u> regarding FDA's authority to issue a No-Tobacco-Sale Order (NTSO).

<u>Creating a Legacy of Tobacco Free HBCUs</u> – *Legacy*. Legacy and eight national partners launched the <u>Tobacco-Free HBCU Campus</u> <u>Initiative</u>, a novel effort led to former U.S. Surgeon General Regina Benjamin to engage all Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) throughout the U.S. to develop and implement a comprehensive smoke- or tobacco-free campus policy. State News

Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Goes Smoke Free (SD) -- The Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe (CRST) is the first tribe in South Dakota to go smoke-free. On May 5, 2015, the CRST Tribal Council officially approved the reservation's Smoke-Free Air Act prohibiting smoking and the use of e-cigarettes in all indoor public places and workplaces.

<u>Governor Fallin Signs Bill to Ban Tobacco from School</u> <u>Campuses</u> (OK) – Governor Mary Fallin signed House bill 1685 or the "24/7 Tobacco-Free Schools Act", requiring all

Oklahoma schools to be tobacco-free. Tobacco use of any kind will not be allowed on school grounds, in school vehicles, and at any school-sponsored or school-sanctioned event or activity.

<u>Crescent City Passes New Laws</u> (CA) – Crescent City Council passed two new ordinances restricting the location of new tobacco and alcohol retailers (or current retailers expanding their business), requiring them to obtain a Conditional Use Permit (CUP). These laws will go into effect on May 20, 2015 and include conditions such as reduced window advertising, state law requirements, and product placement.

In the News

<u>CVS Health Reports Record First Quarter Results per Removal of</u> <u>Tobacco Products</u> – *PR Newswire.* Net revenues for the company increased by 11.1% to \$3.6 billion since March 31, 2015. The Retail Pharmacy Segment was positively impacted by increased sales, an improved front store margin rate largely driven by the removal of tobacco products and favorable purchasing economics.

NAQC MDS ENDS Workgroup –*NAQC*. The North American Quitline Consortium (NAQC) announced the creation of the NAQC Minimal Data Set (MDS) workgroup on Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS), per findings from their November 2014 report *Cessation Treatment and E-Cigarettes*. The workgroup will focus on developing standard questions to assess e-cigarette use, reason for use, amount and frequency of use, and intention to quit by August 1, 2015.

<u>Liquid Nicotine Safety Resources | Prevent Child Injury</u> – *CSN.* Prevent Child Injury created a <u>Liquid Nicotine Safety Resources</u> toolkit to address liquid nicotine (used in e-cigarettes) poisoning in children. The toolkit contains a user guide, project materials



developed by Prevent Child Injury members, a compilation of existing resources, and a list of spokespeople who are leaders in the field.

Research

Correlates of Hookah Use and Predictors of Hookah Trial in U.S. Young Adults – American Journal of Preventive Medicine. Key Findings: Significant predicators of hookah trial include college enrollment; alcohol, marijuana, and cigarette use; and perceptions that hookah is less harmful than cigarettes.

A Multistate Asian-Language Tobacco Quitline: Addressing a

Disparity in Access to Care – American Journal of Public Health. **Key Findings:** Based on a sample of three Asian-languagespeaking communities in California, Colorado, and Hawaii, a total of 2,004 smokers called for state cessation services, with 88.3% opting for counseling. The intervention protocol, based on an efficacy trial, was successfully translated into a multistate service and further disseminated.

Why Do Smokers Try to Quit Without Medication or Counseling? A Qualitative Study with Ex-Smokers – *BMJ.* **Key Findings:** New explanations were produced as to why smokers quit unassisted: 1) prioritization of lay knowledge gained directly and indirectly from personal experience and peers, 2) evaluation of costs and benefits of quitting unassisted, 3) belief that quitting is a personal responsibility, and 4) perception that quitting unassisted is the "right" or "better" choice in terms of self-identify or self-image.
