FDA Launches "Fresh Empire" Anti-Tobacco Campaign
Aimed at Multicultural Teens

FDA

FDA announced the launch of "Fresh Empire," a national multi-platform public education campaign aimed at multicultural youth aged 12-17 who identify with hip-hop culture. The campaign highlights how values of hip-hop culture, such as creativity, confidence, and individuality, are consistent with a tobacco-free lifestyle. "We know from our research that remaining in control is an important pillar of hip-hop culture," says Mitch Zeller, director of FDA's Center for Tobacco Products. "The 'Fresh Empire' campaign underscores that important message to hip-hop youth, empowering this at-risk peer crowd to live tobacco free."

In the News

Hookah Smoking on the Rise Among High School Seniors -

PRWeb. According to a study by University of Pittsburgh Center for Research on Media, Technology, and Health, nearly 1 in 5 high school seniors reported having smoked hookah in the past year with a third reporting regular use. Data collected from University of Michigan's Monitoring the Future Study found that hookah smokers were more likely to be male, Caucasian, reside in single parent homes, and have poor grades. Hookah users are exposed to many of the same toxic substances found in cigarettes. Comparisons suggest that an hour of hookah smoking exposes the user to 20 to 40 times the tar found in one cigarette. New interventions to prevent hookah smoking are stagnant and the visibility of this form of tobacco is not under heavy surveillance.

Most Tobacco-Using Teens Start with Flavored Products – Reuters Health. An FDA Center for Tobacco Products study of 46,000 adolescents and adults found that flavored tobacco is appealing to America's youth and can be found in a variety of products. Of the adolescents who reported using tobacco in the past 30 days, 80 percent noted flavored tobacco incentivized them to try their first tobacco product.

Poll: Most Americans Support FDA Regulation of E-Cigarettes – National Public Radio (NPR). According to an NPR-Truven Health Analytics Health Poll, 57 percent of Americans said that FDA should regulate e-cigarettes like tobacco products. Those older than 65, those with a college degree, and those who make more than \$100,000 a year were most likely to agree with the prompt.

Research

A Review of Smoking Policies in Airports around the World

– British Medical Journal. Key Findings: Smoking policies of major international airports in five regions were analyzed and compared to in-country tobacco control legislation. According to the report, nearly 52 percent of the airports had designated smoking rooms, and 59 percent of these airports were located in countries with national legislation allowing for smoking zones, compared to 35.3 percent located in smoke-free countries. While there is increasing legislation at the local level, addressing stringent laws for smoke-free zone airports are often overlooked and not included in national or subnational policies.

State Medicaid Coverage for Tobacco Cessation Treatments and Barriers to Coverage — United States, 2014–2015 – CDC. **Key Findings:** To assess the current state of Medicaid tobacco cessation coverage, the American Lung Association compiled information from several state Medicaid sources, including websites, handbooks, policy manuals, and relevant legislation. Researchers found that nine states covered all recommended treatments for Medicaid enrollees as of June 2014, up from six the previous year, but that enrollment barriers (e.g., enrollee access, promoting coverage, and monitoring the use of treatments) are issues in these states and in others that partially cover cessation treatments. Researchers note that states can improve use of tobacco cessation treatments in this subpopulation by removing these barriers and covering all approved evidence-based tobacco cessation therapies.
