FDA Issues Product Marketing Orders Through Premarket
Tobacco Application Pathway

FDA

Following a rigorous scientific review, the FDA announced that for the first time it has authorized the marketing of new tobacco products through the premarket tobacco application pathway. This action permits the tobacco products to be sold in the United States, but does not mean that they are safe or "FDA approved." The marketing orders are for eight Swedish Match North America Inc. snus smokeless tobacco products under the general brand name. The recent decisions for these products reflect evidence showing that these products, marketed as described in the manufacturer's application, would result in a low likelihood of new initiation, delayed cessation, or relapse and that these products would likely provide less toxic options if current adult smokeless tobacco users used them exclusively.

8th Biennial Cancer Survivorship Research Exploding E-Cigarette Puts Florida Man in Critical Condition – Fox News. Doctors put Evan Spahlinger, 21, in a medically-induced coma to alleviate pain resulting from an incident in which an ecigarette exploded, resulting in severe burns and lung damage. Spahlinger's sister reports that she found her brother not breathing with face and neck burns after hearing an explosion. Firefighters suspect that the explosion was caused by the e-cigarette's lithium battery.

Research

Rapid Increase in Advertising Spending for E-cigarettes -

Tobacco Control. **Key Findings**: A review of spending in 2014 for advertising of e-cigarettes in the United States reveals that the introduction of the MarkTen product by Altria contributed to a 52 percent increase in spending from 2013 to 2014. MarkTen was introduced in mid-2014 and within a short time Altria spent more than \$35 million in advertising, surpassing the former industry leader, blu, which spent \$30 million. The researchers also noted that the advertising tactics in magazines included themes that may appeal to youth.

Strategies to Support Tobacco Cessation and Tobacco-Free Environments in Mental Health and Substance Abuse Facilities – CDC. Key Findings: Evaluators aimed to identify effective strategies implemented by Oregon and Utah to promote smoking cessation and ensure smoke-free environments in mental health and substance abuse treatment settings. The three key strategies that evaluators identified are: (1) being ready for the opportunity to go tobacco free by involving partners and implementing an action plan, (2) having a sound infrastructure of relevant leadership and other supporters to move towards cessation and share successes, and (3) having a branded initiative to make the project visible to those impacted. These strategies can serve as lessons learned for other states looking to

Tobacco Product Use Among Sexual Minority Adults:

Findings From the 2012-2013 National Adult Tobacco

Survey – American Journal of Preventive Medicine. Key

Findings: Researchers analyzed data from the 2012-2013

National Adult Tobacco Survey to better understand smoking patterns of different sexual minority populations in relation to non-minority "straight" populations. Smoking prevalence was found to be higher among sexual minority adults (27.4%) compared to the straight adults (17.3%), and is especially high among bisexual women (36.0%).

Sexual minority men and women also used e-cigarettes and hookah at greater rates than straight men and women when compared by gender. Researchers say that these findings demonstrate a need for tobacco control efforts aimed specifically at the sexual minority subpopulation.
