- According to a <u>laboratory experiment</u> published in the *European Respiratory Journal*, inhalation of ecigarette vapor may <u>make</u> lung cells more susceptible to pneumonia-causing bacteria.

<u>9th National Summit on</u> <u>Smokeless Tobacco</u> <u>Prevention</u> – Health Education FDA and HHS following a Not Substantially Equivalent determination on UST's Copenhagen Bold smokeless tobacco product.

Research

- An analysis in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research* looked at tobacco use data and state tobacco policy data, <u>concluding</u> that having well-enforced tobacco control policies in place is associated with lower cigarette and e-cigarette use statewide.
- A Public Health Reports analysis of smoking data and health insurance data <u>found</u> that smoking prevalence in the United States ranged from 14.6 percent of adults with private insurance to 34.7 percent of Medicaid enrollees.
- An analysis of youth survey data published in the Journal of Adolescent Health found that 37.5 percent of American students agree that intermittent e-cigarette use causes little or no harm, compared to 9.7 percent of students with regards to intermittent cigarette use.
- A nationally representative cohort study of 357,420 participants published in *JAMA Internal Medicine* <u>concluded</u> that exclusive cigarette, cigar, and pipe smokers all had significantly increased mortality risk over the course of the 26-year study period, with cigarette smoking being the most dangerous.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health (PATH) study data <u>found</u> that adolescents aged 12-17 were more likely to report purchasing tobacco products and being tobacco users at follow-up if they received a tobacco product coupon during the study period.

2018 Tobacco-Free Grants for Minority-Serving Institutions, Community and Women's Colleges

Deadline: April 10 Virtually all smokers start smoking before 26 years old. That's why over the past three years, Truth Initiative has awarded funding to 135 historically black colleges, universities, and community colleges to advocate for the adoption and implementation of a 100 percent smoke- or tobacco-free policy. Truth Initiative is accepting applications for its Tobacco-Free College Program, which now offers grants of up to \$20,000 to women's colleges, minority-serving academic institutions, and community colleges.

PAR-17-218 – U.S. Tobacco Control Policies to Reduce Health Disparities (R21) Deadline: June 15, 2020 NIH published an open-funding opportunity announcement (FOA) to support observational or intervention research focused on reducing health disparities in tobacco use in the United States.
