Partner Announcements

- FDA Commissioner Scott
 Gottlieb announced an advance notice of proposed rulemaking to receive public comments as FDA considers setting a nicotine content standard for combustible cigarettes. ASTHO issued a brief statement supporting the announcement. Gottlieb subsequently announced an advance notice of proposed rulemaking for public comments on the population health impacts of tobacco flavorings, including menthol, and announced an advance notice of proposed rulemaking to learn more about the population health impacts of premium cigars.
- ASTHO <u>released</u> its <u>Building a Healthier</u>
 Nationreport, recognizing tobacco use as one of several contributors to chronic disease deserving ongoing public health prevention funding.
- Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids <u>published</u> Big Tobacco: Tiny Targets, a research initiative which uncovered evidence of tobacco industry marketing to youth around the world.
- A **Truth Initiative** published a <u>peer-reviewed</u>
 <u>study</u>on the impacts of menthol tobacco,
 an <u>overview</u> of cigarette butt litter as an

- The Geographic Health Equity
 Alliance <u>released</u> a new report that provides recommendations to public health stakeholders on how to address rural cancer disparities.
- The Public Health Law Center <u>published</u> a comprehensive report detailing the tobacco product regulatory plan laid out by FDA in July 2017.
- National Native Network <u>posted</u> a recording of their Jan. 31 webinar discussing the availability of tobacco cessation services in Indian Country.
- Rescue Agency <u>published</u> a video presentation highlighting how teen cultural segmentation impacts tobacco use behaviors and drives tobacco control messaging.
- Counter Tools <u>posted</u> a recording of their March 15 webinar discussing point of sale tobacco advertising and youth engagement.
- The U.S. Preventive Services Task
 Force opened a public comment period on its draft research plan for tobacco smoking cessation in adults, including pregnant women.

State News

- A constitutional amendment being <u>considered</u> in **Florida** would divert some of the \$70 million in tobacco settlement funds annually earmarked to tobacco control into cancer research.
- Legislators in both houses of the <u>Rhode</u>
 <u>Island</u> and <u>Maryland</u> state legislatures introduced bills to raise the tobacco purchase age to 21 in

Funding Opportunities

2018 Tobacco-Free Grants for Minority-Serving Institutions, Community and Women's Colleges

Deadline: April 10 Virtually all smokers start smoking before 26 years old. That's why over the past three years, Truth Initiative has awarded funding to 135 historically black colleges, universities, and community colleges to advocate for the adoption and implementation of a 100 percent smoke- or tobacco-free policy. Truth Initiative is accepting applications for its Tobacco-Free College Program, which now offers grants of up to \$20,000 to women's colleges, minority-serving academic institutions, and community colleges.

PAR-17-218 – U.S. Tobacco Control Policies to Reduce each state.

 Larry Wolk (SHO-CO) <u>sent</u> a letter to the state's school administrators, discouraging JUUL ecigarettes for tobacco control education in schools.

In the News

- A CNN news story <u>summarizes</u> the invention of ecigarettes, their rise to popularity, and the current state of e-cigarette research.
- Public health advocates are <u>concerned</u> that legalized marijuana in states like California pose a threat to comprehensive smoke-free policies prohibiting the use of marijuana and tobacco products in public spaces.
- A Slate story <u>overviews</u> how tobacco companies have marketed products specifically to the LGBTQ community, resulting in disproportionate smoking and death rates.

Research

- A simulation model developed by FDA researchers published in *The New England Journal of Medicineestimates* that reducing nicotine content in cigarettes to make them non-addictive would result in a smoking prevalence of 1.4 percent in 2060.
- An analysis of National Youth Tobacco Survey data published in MMWR found that 78.2 percent of youth were exposed to e-cigarette advertising in 2016, compared to 68.9 percent in 2014. This observed increase is attributable to increased marketing exposure in retail settings.

Health Disparities (R21)

Deadline: June 15, 2020
NIH published an open-funding opportunity announcement (FOA) to support observational or intervention research focused on reducing health disparities in tobacco use in the United States. The FOA is intended to stimulate scientific inquiry focused on innovative tobacco control policies.

- The results of a statistical model published in PLOS
 One indicate that when taking into account smoking
 cessation and harm reduction, e-cigarettes present
 a net harm to population health because of initiation
 of non-smokers.
- A survey of small businesses published in Health
 Affairs found that 47 percent of employers with
 health insurance surcharges in place for tobacco
 users do not offer a tobacco cessation program to
 their employees.
- A Tobacco Control meta-analysis of 11 studies concluded that there is a statistically significant association between the tobacco retailer density around adolescents' homes and their likelihood of smoking in the past month.
