Clearing the Air: An Institute for Policy Advocacy, XI – American Nonsmokers' Rights Foundation Ridgedale, MO comprehensive best practices user guide on health communications in tobacco prevention and control.

- FDA <u>published</u> a guidance document to assist tobacco product manufacturers in reporting their ingredients listings to FDA by the May 8 or Nov. 8 deadlines.
- The Public Health Law Center <u>published</u> a series of materials pertaining to recent FDA rulemaking announcements, including talking point recommendations for public health professionals on the topics of <u>reduced nicotine levels</u>, <u>tobacco</u> <u>flavorings</u>, and <u>premium cigar regulations</u>.
- The American Lung Association and the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Centerreleased an online toolkit featuring a new series of materials aimed at helping state and local officials and public health advocates increase coverage and access to evidence-based tobacco cessation treatments for Medicaid enrollees.

<u>State of Black Health National</u> <u>Conference</u> – National African An ordinance <u>proposed</u> by Chicago, **Illinois** Mayor Rahm Emmanuel would require all retailers that sell tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, to post a sign near their entrance detailing the dangers of smoking and listing tobacco quitline information.

In the News

- R.J. Reynolds Vapor Co. <u>recalled</u> 2.6 million Vuse electronic cigarettes due to fire risk from overheated batteries.
- An extended study that <u>tracked</u> 2,400 participants for a full year concluded that both Chantix and Zyban do not pose a cardiovascular risk greater than nicotine patches or placebo.

Research

- An overview of disease, injury, and risk factor data from 1990-2016 <u>published</u> in *JAMA* found that in 2016, tobacco use was the top contributor to disability-adjusted life-years lost in 32 states among all health behaviors.
- A Tobacco Control meta-analysis of 36 studies worldwide <u>found</u> that a 10 percent price increase is associated with a significantly reduced demand of cigars (8.3%), roll your own tobacco (6.4%), and bidis (5.7%).
- An analysis of National Youth Tobacco Survey
 data <u>published</u> in *Tobacco Control* found that a
 majority of students overestimated prevalence of
 youth cigarette (74.0%) and e-cigarette (61.0%)
 use, with prevalence overestimating correlating with
 increased likelihood of tobacco product use.

- A study of over 1.6 million cancer cases from 10 state cancer registries <u>published</u> in *Cancer* found that only 51 percent of cases had cigarette use data, with 51 percent of those individuals with cancer diagnoses being never smokers.
- A Tobacco Control laboratory screening of liquid and aerosolized e-cigarette refills concluded that 91 percent of glycerin-based aerosols are cytotoxic, and that e-cigarette liquids are a strong predictor of aerosol cytotoxicity.
