#### **Partner Announcements**

- FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>announced</u> that
  FDA is taking action to address the use of JUUL
  vaping products among minors, including a largescale national investigation of e-cigarette retailers
  and an information request to JUUL Labs. In
  partnership with FTC, FDA subsequently
  <u>announced</u> warning letters to e-cigarette
  manufacturers whose packaging imitates juices
  boxes, candies, and other products that appeal to
  children.
- CDC researchers <u>published</u> an article in *Prevention* Chronic Disease exploring the intersections of
   cigarette smoking and receiving federal housing
   assistance. The study found that 33 percent of
   those receiving federal housing assistance are
   current smokers.
- The American Public Health Association's 2018
   Alcohol Tobacco and Other Drugs Section Awards
   is calling for nominations through June 22.
- The Public Health Law Center published an updated <u>overview</u> of preemption in tobacco legislation and released an updated <u>version</u> of their

APHA 2018 Annual Meeting & Expo – American Public Health Association state e-cigarette regulations map.

- Recordings of two NACCHO smoke-free housing webinars convened in April are now <u>available</u> online.
- Truth Initiative details the findings of a study published in Tobacco Control, which found that 63 percent of youth do not know that JUUL products always contain nicotine and that 25 percent of youth indicate that "JUULing" is distinct from e-cigarette use.

#### **State News**

- An amendment <u>asking</u> Florida voters to include ecigarettes in the state's smoke-free law will appear on the November ballot.
- The Minnesota Department of Health <u>published</u> an informational toolkit to aid schools in the prevention of e-cigarette use among students.
- A bill in Louisiana that would <u>prohibit</u> smoking in bars, casinos, and sports venues has gone back to committee as state lawmakers worry that the bill could impact revenue.
- A coalition of cancer patients and survivors
  has <u>asked</u> the **Pennsylvania** state legislature to
  close exemptions to the state's clean indoor air law,
  which currently permits smoking in some bars,
  restaurants, private clubs, truck stops, and hotel
  rooms.

#### In the News

- Following FDA's announcement that it is addressing JUUL e-cigarette use among youth, JUUL Labs <u>announced</u> that it will spend \$30 million to support state and federal initiatives to raise the tobacco purchase age to 21.
- A <u>study</u> published in <u>Circulation estimated</u> that men and women at age 50 who follow five health habits, including not smoking, live more than a decade longer than those who adopt none of these healthy habits.
- A <u>study</u> published in <u>Pediatrics concluded</u> that ecigarette use among youth aged 12 to 17 is associated with a significantly increased likelihood of marijuana use as adolescents.


Research

- A Tobacco Control study of tobacco retailers located on U.S. Air Force bases <u>found</u> that cigarettes were 11-12 percent cheaper on base compared to retailers located in close proximity.
- An experiment involving different e-cigarette
  product health warnings published in Nicotine &
  Tobacco Research concluded that graphic and text
  warnings were more effective than text warnings
  alone with regards to fewer e-cigarette cravings and
  less susceptibility to e-cigarette use among study
  participants.
- An analysis of Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health study data published in *Tobacco Control* found that 48.8 percent of adult e-cigarette users at baseline discontinued use over the course of a oneyear follow-up period. In addition, 44.3 percent of continuous e-cigarette users maintained dual use
