### **Partner Announcements**

- CDC <u>announced</u> new smoking data from the 2017
   National Health Interview Survey, which include a lowest ever adult cigarette smoking rate of 13.9 percent.
- CDC <u>published</u> a factsheet for parents, educators, and health care providers on e-cigarettes shaped like USB flash drives, such as JUULs.
- The FDA <u>published</u> an infographic that highlights key findings on middle school and high school tobacco use from the 2017 National Youth Tobacco Survey. FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>praised</u> the observed reductions in youth tobacco use between 2011 and 2017.
- WHO <u>released</u> the second edition of their Global Report on Trends in Prevalence of Tobacco Smoking, which looks at global data and projections from 2000 to 2025.
- A CDC QuickStats report <u>highlights</u> the relationship between age, psychological distress, and tobacco use prevalence among adults.
- The American Lung Association <u>published</u> a comprehensive billing guide for stakeholders on tobacco screening cessation services.

# Incorporating Tobacco Dependence Treatment in Curricula and/or Residency Programs

Deadline: July 2

Oklahoma is looking to connect with any states that have worked with universities/state regents/boards to incorporate tobacco dependence treatment within curriculum and/or residency programs.

## **Dual Treatment of Tobacco and Marijuana in Youth Deadline:** July 3

As a state with legalized use of marijuana for medical and recreational use, Colorado is seeing additional challenges with tobacco cessation due to dual use. Evidence-based treatment for tobacco cessation among youth is minimal. Co-use with marijuana makes it even more challenging.

Anecdotal evidence from our local public health agencies and other partners indicate that we have an urgent need for protocols around tobacco and marijuana combination treatment among youth. Colorado would be immensely grateful for ideas and strategies that other states and territories are using or thinking about as options for tobacco and marijuana cessation among youth.

## **State News**

- San Francisco, California residents voted to uphold a ban on the sale menthol cigarettes and flavored ecigarette liquids.
- A research paper published in *Tobacco Control* found that the implementation of flavored tobacco restrictions in Minneapolis and St.

  Paul, **Minnesota** was associated with decreased availability of flavored tobacco in convenience and grocery stores, and increased availability of unflavored tobacco products.
- A study by the Pennsylvania Alliance to Tobacco Control <u>found</u> that 2,300 workplaces are exempt from the state's current smoke-free legislation.

### In the News

 The Associated Press <u>published</u> an article detailing how e-cigarette and vaporizer sellers have started offering college scholarships as a marketing tactic.

### Research

- An <u>analysis</u> of smoke-free college and university data published in *MMWR* concluded that at least 2,082 colleges and universities in the U.S. were smoke-free as of Nov. 2017.
- A cost-effectiveness analysis of smoking cessation interventions published in *Tobacco* Control concluded that cell phone interventions are a cost-effective use of healthcare resources for low socioeconomic groups.
