- A summary of 2015 BRFSS health behavior and health outcome data <u>published</u> by **CDC** researchers in *MMWR* indicates that from 2013-2015, the current cigarette smoking rate in the United States declined from 19.3 percent to 17.7 percent.
- FDA <u>published</u> an article discussing potential public health risks and benefits of flavoring in tobacco products in reference to FDA's request for <u>public</u> <u>comments</u> on tobacco flavors.

State News

- A study published in *Preventing Chronic* Diseasediscussed the process of developing and implementing smoke-free housing policies among early adopter public housing authorities in North Carolina and Georgia.
- On July 1, a cigarette tax increase from \$1.03 to \$2.03 took effect in Oklahoma and an increase from \$0.60 to \$1.10 went into effect in Kentucky.

In the News

- Tobacco companies are <u>required</u> to issue mandated corrective statements on their websites in connection to a 2006 federal court ruling that found cigarette manufacturers guilty of misleading the public about their products.
- Fourteen senators <u>signed</u> a letter to FDA
 Commissioner Scott Gottlieb requesting more information on FDA tobacco regulatory decisions and processes, such as the delay on regulating certain tobacco products and their rulemaking process with regards to tobacco products.
- The World Trade Organization <u>ruled</u> that an Australia policy requiring plain packaging of tobacco products does not violate international trade regulations, a decision that may encourage

Generation Campus Initiative, which provides grants to accelerate and expand the adoption and implementation of 100 percent smoke- and tobacco-free policies on college and university campuses across the nation.

2018 Tobacco-Free Grants for Minority-Serving Institutions, Community and Women's Colleges

NIH published an open-funding opportunity announcement (FOA) to support observational or intervention research focused on reducing health disparities in tobacco use in the United States. The FOA is intended to stimulate scientific inquiry focused on innovative tobacco control policies.

more nations to implement this policy.

- Juul Labs Inc. <u>announced</u> that they will no longer feature models on its social media accounts. The company is also dedicating an internal team to remove inappropriate content relating to their products from social media platforms.
- Researchers at Boston University <u>discovered</u> a
 possible link between flavorings in e-cigarettes and
 damage to cardiovascular health.

Research

- A Pediatrics analysis of 2016 National Youth
 Tobacco Survey data found that 10.5 percent of
 U.S. middle- and high-school youth report having
 ever smoked hookah in their lifetimes. In addition, it
 is reported that the home environment is where
 youth hookah smoking most frequently takes place.
- A Journal of the National Cancer Institute study of longitudinal smoking cessation data <u>calls</u> into question the efficacy of nicotine replacement therapy and prescription pharmacotherapy in encouraging tobacco abstinence at one-year followup.
- An analysis of Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health Study data published in *Tobacco Control*<u>concluded</u> that receiving a tobacco coupon by direct mail or email was associated with smoking initiation among non-smokers, increased smoking frequency among non-daily smokers, and smoking relapse among former smokers.
