Funding Methodologies for Local Health Departments **Deadline:** Oct. 12

Oregon is gathering information about formulas or conventions used by other state tobacco control programs in the administration of local health department grants or contracts. State News

- California Gov. Jerry Brown <u>vetoed</u> two bills that would prohibit smoking on state beaches and parks, making it the third time that such policies have made it to the governor's desk without receiving his signature.
- New Washington, D.C. policies took effect on Oct.
 1, including a \$2 tax increase on cigarettes, a tax increase on other tobacco products such as ecigarettes based on wholesale pricing, and a change of the tobacco purchase age from 18 to 21.
- In Montana, the tobacco industry is contributing to efforts opposing an upcoming ballot measure that would increase tobacco taxes to help fund a permanent expansion of state Medicaid.

In the News

- President Trump <u>signed</u> a \$855 billion FY19 spending bill that includes level funding of \$210 million to the CDC Office on Smoking and Health as part of HHS appropriations.
- Several items about emerging tobacco industry products have made national news:
 - FDA <u>conducted</u> a surprise inspection of the San Francisco headquarters of JUUL Labs, seizing thousands of documents from the company that now holds 73 percent of the nation's e-cigarette market.
 - A Reuters report <u>alleges</u> that a series of USB-style vaping products mimicking the popular JUUL devices appeared on the market after FDA's August 2016 deadline for tobacco products to be sold in the United States without pre-market review.
 - Philip Morris International <u>anticipates</u> a steep increase in global sales for its iQOS heated tobacco products as it partners with dentists, pharmacists, hotels, and life insurance providers.
 - In an interview with Tech Crunch, JUUL
 Labs co-founder James
 Monsees <u>shared</u> that removing flavors from JUUL products is under consideration amid growing pressure from FDA to curb underage access to e-cigarette products.
 - Imperial Brands, the manufacturer of Winston cigarettes, <u>announced</u> it would continue development of its blu e-cigarette products and <u>expressed</u> interest in investing in the global legal cannabis market.



Research

- E-cigarette sales data <u>published</u> in *JAMA* found that between 2016-2017, JUUL product sales increased 641 percent, culminating in a 29 percent e-cigarette market share in Dec. 2017.
- A survey of 605 postsecondary educational institutions published in the American Journal of Public Health found that 53.7 percent of such institutions do not have any smoke- or tobacco-free policy in place, with private institutions being most likely to have no established policy.
- A Tobacco Control laboratory study concluded that iQOS heated tobacco products emit significantly fewer carcinogenic tobacco-specific nitrosamines than combustible cigarettes, but significantly more than e-cigarettes.
- A Journal of Clinical Psychiatry analysis of annual survey data <u>found</u> that non-daily cigarette use doubled from 2005 to 2014.
