State News

- Campaign reports <u>indicate</u> that the lobbying arms of Philip Morris USA and RJ Reynolds contributed \$6.5 million opposing the **South Dakota** ballot initiative that would increase cigarette taxes by \$1.53 per pack.
- Virginia state legislators are <u>considering</u> a proposal drafted by Altria Group to update the state's tax policies on tobacco products, which may include an excise tax exemption for heated tobacco products like iQOS.
- Rhode Island participants in CDC's 6|18 Initiative <u>published</u> a poster outlining their goals,

The Association of State and Territorial Health Officials is the national nonprofit association representing the state and territorial public health agencies of the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the District results, and lessons learned relating to the expansion of tobacco cessation treatment availability to state Medicaid recipients.

In the News

- A Buzzfeed News report describes that JUUL Labs has offered several school districts as much as \$20,000 to adopt a now discontinued anti-vaping curriculum developed by the company that has been scrutinized by research scientists.
- Amid FDA scrutiny of e-cigarette manufacturers, Altria Group <u>announced</u> that they would cease selling their pod e-cigarette products and that they would support federal policy to increase the purchase age of combustible tobacco and ecigarettes to 21.
- A story in *Business Insider* <u>summarizes</u> the currently available research on JUUL use among youth, concluding that teens are unknowingly being exposed to nicotine and heavy metals.
- Vitamin vaping, a rising trend in which electronic vaping devices are <u>utilized</u> to inhale vaporized vitamins and other nutrients into one's lungs, has drawn the criticism of scientists who question the products' safety and efficacy.

Research

 Researchers from CDC <u>published</u> an *MMWR* surveillance summary that details the approximately 3.3 million tobacco-associated cancer cases reported in the United States between 2010 and 2014. of Columbia. ASTHO members, the chief health officials of these jurisdictions, are dedicated to formulating and influencing sound public health policy and to ensuring excellence in state-based public health practice.



- A study of pictorial cigarette warnings published in *Tobacco Control* concluded that warnings depicting diseased and damaged body parts were most effective across all measured outcomes in a sample of current adult smokers.
- A survey published in the International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health concluded that adult aided recall of the Tips from Former Smokers and The Real Cost national advertising campaigns was strong (65.5% and 71.6% respectively), and that black adolescents were more likely than white adolescents to recall the Fresh Empire campaign.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research survey of adult cigarette smokers found that only 5.5 percent of participants were aware that sugar is added to cigarettes, and only 3.8 percent accurately indicated that added sugar increases the toxins found in cigarette smoke.
- A Journal of Adolescent Health analysis of JUUL Labs' Twitter account <u>estimated</u> that one-quarter of Twitter users sharing JUUL Labs tweets are adolescents.
