Partner Announcements

- **FDA** Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>announced</u> new proposed tobacco regulatory actions, including:
 - A restriction on the sale of most flavored e-cigarette products in retailers that are not age-restricted to adults
 - Strengthening of online age-verification measures for the sale of most flavored ecigarettes
 - A ban on menthol as a flavoring in combustible tobacco products

- In recognition of the American Cancer Society's<u>Great American Smokeout</u> on Nov. 15:
 - ASTHO Chief Medical Officer Marcus Plescia <u>authored</u> a blog post discussing the public health importance of smoking cessation and discussing what states can do to support cessation among those who want to quit.
 - CDC <u>published</u> a feature providing tips to smokers interested in quitting.
- FDA partnered with Scholastic to distribute an infographic and other educational materials to thousands of high school educators and administrators nationwide, encouraging them to talk to students about the health risks of e-cigarette use.
- The Public Health Law Center <u>updated</u> their resources detailing state e-cigarette regulations, including complete listings of laws that define and tax e-cigarettes at the state level.
- NCI <u>published</u> a GIS story detailing the impact of tobacco use on lung cancer through maps and data.

State News

- Ballot initiatives to increase tobacco taxes in Montana and South Dakota both failed, with 45.7 percent and 44.9 percent of voters supporting these measures, respectively. According to Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, tobacco companies spent a combined \$24 million in opposition of these initiatives.
- A Tobacco Control study of San Francisco, California corner store owners <u>found</u> that retailers reported customers purchasing fewer cigarettes and switching to new

The FOA is intended to stimulate scientific inquiry focused on innovative tobacco control policies.

In the News

- Fontem Ventures, the division of Imperial Brands that produces blu e-cigarette products, will <u>raise</u> the purchase age for its products online to 21 while continuing to sell all of its flavors online and in retail stores.
- JUUL Labs <u>announced</u> that they will raise the online purchase age of its products to 21 and will temporarily stop selling some of their flavored products in over 90,000 U.S. retailers.

Research

- New CDC data <u>published</u> in *MMWR* found that 20.8 percent of high school students and 4.9 percent of middle school students reported current e-cigarette use in 2018, which represents a 78 percent and 48 percent increase compared to 2017.
- A study published in the *Journal of the American Heart Association* <u>found</u> that physicians referred only 16 percent of artery disease patients who were current smokers to smoking cessation services.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of cigarette smoking and mental disorder data from 2012-13 <u>concluded</u> that tobacco use rates remain higher among those with mental health disorders compared to the general adult population, and quit attempt rates remain significantly lower.
