Deadline: Jan. 29

- An American Cancer Society report published in CA: A Cancer Journal for Clinicians concluded that the overall cancer death rate in the United States was 27 percent lower in 2016 compared to 1991, citing reductions in cigarette smoking as a major factor contributing to this decline.
- ChangeLab Solutions announced a new CDCfunded cooperative agreement in which they'll provide training and capacity building pertaining to state tobacco prevention and control policies and strategies to as many as five states.

- Public Health Law Center <u>published</u> a report that provides an in-depth look at policy options to regulate the location of tobacco retailers in the interest of public health.
- The American Cancer Society Cancer Action
 Network and Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids
 announced the release of an updated tobacco tax
 projection model. Those interested in seeing
 tobacco tax projections for a specific state can get

 regional advocacy director.
- FDA posted materials from the Oct. 22-23, 2018 public meeting on tobacco product application review policies and processes.
- New state tobacco control success stories are now <u>available</u> on CDC's "National Tobacco Control Programs in Action" webpage.

State News

- Several states have proposed bills that would raise the statewide tobacco purchasing age to 21, including <u>New Mexico</u>, <u>New York</u>, <u>Vermont</u>, and Washington.
- A Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth grant <u>resulted</u> in the launch of Rethink Vape, an educational campaign on the composition and health risks of e-cigarettes.

In the News

 JUUL Labs <u>announced</u> a new \$10 million national television advertising campaign, which will air exclusively after 10 p.m. local time, to convince The TCN's mission is to improve the public's health by providing education and state-based expertise to tobacco prevention and control at the state and national levels.

The TCN is a network of tobacco program managers and staff from state and territorial health departments as well as Funder's Alliance organizations, and a peer group of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO) on behalf of the CDC's Office on Smoking and Health.

- adult cigarette smokers to switch to JUUL ecigarettes.
- New research published in *Pediatrics* indicates that
 in jurisdictions with strong retail licensing policies
 for tobacco vendors teens were less likely to begin
 using cigarettes and e-cigarettes compared to
 jurisdictions with poor licensing regulations.
- FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>announced</u> on Twitter that he'll be once again meeting with ecigarette manufacturers to discuss their role in addressing the youth e-cigarette epidemic.
- 22nd Century, a manufacturer of low nicotine cigarettes, <u>filed</u> a modified-risk tobacco product application with FDA.

Research

- A CDC research article published in *Preventing* Chronic Disease found that 29.1 percent of middle
 and high school students who have never smoked
 hookah reported being curious or susceptible in
 doing so, with a greater risk among students who
 reported ever using other tobacco products.
- An American Journal of Psychiatry cohort study comparing patients with psychosis, their siblings, and healthy control subjects published <u>concluded</u> that quitting smoking among the psychosis group was associated with a significant improvement in processing speed.
- A Tobacco Control experiment that tracked hookah smokers while using hookahs with and without pictorial health warning labels <u>found</u> that health warnings were effective in reducing the number of puffs and puff volume during a smoking session, resulting in less exhaled carbon monoxide.

 A data analysis published in the Journal of Cancer Survivorship found that 12 percent of U.S. cancer survivors are current smokers, and that 66 percent of current smokers received advice from a health professional encouraging them to quit.
