**Tobacco Regulatory Science** 

- ALA <u>released</u> their annual State of Tobacco Control report, which assigns letter grades to each state, Washington, D.C., and the nation as a whole on evidence-based policies to reduce the use of tobacco products.
- NNPHI published Advancing Tobacco Prevention and Control in Rural America, a report that makes recommendations on addressing health disparities caused by disproportionately high tobacco use in rural areas. Erin Boles Welsh served on the review committee for this report while TCN Executive Committee Chair.
- FDA announced bathroom posters from "The Real Cost" campaign in every high school in America. New e-cigarette posters are <u>available</u> on their print materials exchange.
- The National Behavioral Health Network <u>published</u> a comprehensive infographic outlining ten steps that treatment facilities can take to successfully implement a tobacco-free policy.
- FDA <u>filed</u> two No-Tobacco-Sale Orders with a Walgreens and a Circle K retailor found to be in repeated violation of federal law by selling tobacco products to minors.
- AHA <u>published</u> an annual update on the prevalence of heart disease and stroke in the United States, which discusses the reduction of cigarette smoking in recent decades as a major cardiovascular disease risk factor improvement.

- Monica Bharel, commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, <u>published</u> a commentary encouraging parents to talk to their children about the health risks of vaping.
- Officials from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment <u>authored</u> a letter to the editor published in the New England Journal of Medicine discussing predictors of youth e-cigarette use in the state.
- Minnesota <u>published</u> a new case study on its <u>menthol tobacco webpage</u> overviewing examples and recommendations on community-led efforts to address menthol tobacco use in African American communities.
- The Virginia Foundation of Healthy Youth's The Dangers of Other Tobacco Products educational module is now <u>available</u> for download in Spanish.

### In the News

- FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>shared</u> via Twitter that e-cigarette manufacturers could see their products removed from the market pending regulatory review if they're unable to honor commitments to reduce youth e-cigarette use.
- A clinical trial funded by England's National Institute for Health Research <u>concluded</u> that 18 percent of cigarette smokers provided with ecigarettes had quit cigarette smoking after one year, compared to 9.9 percent of smokers who used other smoking cessation products.
- A coalition of organizations advocating for reduced taxes and economic freedoms <u>sent</u> a letter to

health policy and to ensuring excellence in state-based public health practice.



President Trump advocating a rollback of FDA's announced intentions to potentially institute new rules regulating electronic cigarettes.

## Research

- A Preventing Chronic Disease analysis of 2016 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data <u>concluded</u> that state prevalence of current cigarette smoking ranged from 8.8 percent to 24.8 percent among adults, and prevalence of current ecigarette use ranged from 2.4 percent to 6.7 percent in adults.
- The American Journal of Preventive Medicine <u>featured</u> a supplement dedicated to the five-year anniversary of FDA's "The Real Cost" youth smoking prevention campaign.
- A laboratory experiment published in *Nature* <u>concluded</u> that diacetyl and the related compound 2,3-pentanedione, common e-cigarette flavorings, can harm lungs by causing damage to epithelial cells.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of survey data <u>found</u> that trusting health information from medical and public health sources was not correlated with lower rates of e-cigarette use, while trusting information from e-cigarette companies was correlated with lower perceived risks of those products.
