- **ASTHO** <u>published</u> a blog post overviewing bills that states are considering to keep schools free from the use of e-cigarette products.
- FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb <u>announced</u> new enforcement actions on retailers and manufacturers to prevent illegal the sale of tobacco products to minors. Shortly after, Commissioner Gottlieb <u>announced</u> that he will resign from FDA to spend more time with his family.

Funding Opportunities

PAR-17-218 – U.S. Tobacco Control Policies to Reduce Health Disparities (R21)

Deadline: June 15, 2020 NIH published an open-funding opportunity announcement (FOA) to support observational or intervention research focused on reducing health disparities in tobacco use in the United States. The FOA is intended to stimulate scientific inquiry focused on innovative tobacco control policies.

Job Listings

- **CDC** research published in *MMWR* found that 10.3 percent of pregnant women in Oklahoma and 6.5 percent of pregnant women in Texas used e-cigarettes during their pregnancy.
- FDA drafted English and Spanish language <u>social</u> <u>media content</u> for March health observances that stakeholder can use to promote tobacco prevention and cessation.
- A new Truth Initiative video <u>highlights</u> how the tobacco industry targeted African Americans in culturally tailored ad campaigns for menthol tobacco products.
- FDA <u>released</u> a draft guidance on enforcement policies for certain marketed tobacco products. Public comments are <u>welcome</u> until April 30.

State News

- Virginia Gov. Ralph Northam <u>signed</u> into law a bill that raises the state's tobacco purchase age to 21.
- A Colorado bill to add e-cigarettes to the state's clean indoor air act is <u>drawing criticism</u> from marijuana activists who want marijuana use exempted from the bill.
- Tobacco 21 bills are moving forward in <u>Tennessee</u>, <u>Vermont</u>, and <u>Illinois</u>.
- The Vermont Tobacco Control Program <u>published</u> a framework for collaborating with the state Medicaid agency to promote tobacco cessation in *Health Promotion Practice*.

- JUUL Labs revenue is <u>projected</u> to reach \$3.4 billion in 2019, compared to approximately \$1 billion in 2018.
- Representative Nita Lowey, chairwoman of the House Appropriations Committee, <u>criticized</u> FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb for delaying the implementation of a regulation that would have required e-cigarette products to submit review applications by 2018 in order to stay on the shelves.
- British American Tobacco Chief Executive Nicandro Durante publicly <u>challenged</u> the scientific basis for a ban of menthol tobacco products, expressing that such a restriction would not reduce youth cigarette consumption.

States, the U.S. Territories, and the District of Columbia. ASTHO members, the chief health officials of these jurisdictions, are dedicated to formulating and influencing sound public health policy and to ensuring excellence in state-based public health practice.



Research

- CDC research on state-specific tobacco cessation behaviors published in *Preventing Chronic Disease* <u>found</u> that quit attempt prevalence varied from 42.7 percent of smokers to 62.1 percent across states, with variability also observed in quitting interest, successful cessation, and receipt of a doctor's advice to quit.
- A discrete choice experiment published in *Tobacco Control* predicts that a menthol cigarette ban would result in a 5.2 percent reduction in cigarette use and an accompanying 3.8 percent increase in ecigarette use, while a total tobacco products flavor ban would result in 5.2 percent of tobacco users opting out of tobacco products entirely.
- A Journal of the American Heart Association analysis of Jackson Heart Study data <u>found</u> a dose-response relationship between cigarette smoking and peripheral artery disease in

the African American study sample.

 A Nicotine & Tobacco Research experiment of ecigarette product tweets <u>concluded</u> that tweets with health warnings were significantly more likely to elicit negative health perceptions than tweets without such warnings.
