- FDA made a number of announcements relating to their regulation of tobacco products:
 - Commissioner Scott
 Gottlieb announced that FDA will propose
 new policies prohibiting the sale of most ecigarette flavors (exempting mint, menthol,
 and tobacco flavors) in retailers that are
 open to customers under age 18 and that
 these products will have to submit
 premarket applications by August 8, 2021.
 - Following Gottlieb's announcement,
 FDA <u>published</u> a new draft guidance outlining regulation for the aforementioned flavored tobacco products, with public comments <u>requested</u> through April 15.
 - A statement from Commissioner
 Gottlieb <u>outlines</u> FDA's budget for FY2020
 and notes an increase of \$100 million in
 tobacco users fees of deemed products
 such as e-cigarettes.
 - Updated Modified Risk Tobacco Product application materials from R.J. Reynolds for their Camel Snus products are now <u>available</u>.
- ASTHO <u>published</u> a series of Healthy Heart,
 Healthy Brain communications materials tailored for
 American Indian and Alaska Native Communities.
 Requests for printed materials and questions can

- A new scientific statement from AHA published in Circulation <u>outlines</u> growing evidence that water pipe smoking has adverse short-term and long-term cardiovascular impacts.


State News

- Tobacco 21 bills have moved forward in <u>New York</u> and <u>Pennsylvania</u>.
- Hawaii is <u>considering</u> a ban on the sale of all flavored tobacco products, including menthol flavored cigarettes and e-cigarettes.
- Legislators in San
 Francisco, California proposed a bill that would prohibit the sale of e-cigarettes within the city.

In the News

- Ned Sharpless, current head of the NIH, will <u>serve</u> as acting commissioner of FDA following Scott Gottlieb's announced resignation. HHS Secretary Alex Azar said the search for a permanent replacement is underway.
- A federal judge <u>ruled</u> that FDA is required to have graphic warnings for cigarette packs and

- advertising prepared by March 15, 2020.
- Opponents to FDA oversight of e-cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco companies, are likely to <u>lobby</u> the White House and Congress in an effort to subvert proposed regulations.

Research

- A Public Health Reports analysis of adolescent, young adult, and adult tobacco use data <u>found</u> that adolescent and young adults preferred fruit and candy e-cigarette flavor types, and had severalfold greater odds of using those e-cigarette flavors than adults.
- An analysis of sudden unexpected infant death (SUID) data published in *Pediatrics* concluded that the odds of SUID increased linearly as maternal cigarette smoking intensity increased.
- Self-reported data from a smoking cessation trial published in *Nicotine & Tobacco* Research indicates that cigarette smokers who began using e-cigarettes decreased their use of cigarettes but increased their nicotine dependence.
- A long-term study on smoking cessation and rheumatoid arthritis (RA) published in Arthritis Care & Research found that current smoking increases the likelihood of developing RA, and that increased duration of smoking cessation reduces RA risk.

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
