- The American Lung Association <u>published</u> its annual State of Tobacco Control report, which provides letter grades to the nation as a whole and to individual state for their tobacco control policies.
- FDA made the following announcements related to tobacco product regulation:
 - FDA <u>sent</u> a warning letter to Smart Toothpicks LLC for several violations regarding sales of the company's nicotinecontaining toothpicks.
 - FDA published an update to the Modified Risk Tobacco Product applications filed by 22nd Century Group Inc. for its <u>low nicotine</u> <u>cigarettes</u> and by Philip Morris Products SA for its <u>IQOS products</u>.
- The American Nonsmokers' Rights Foundation <u>published</u> its Smokefree Lists and Maps quarterly update, which details tobacco control policies across states and municipalities.
- CDC reports that, as of Feb. 4, it has identified 2,758 cases of e-cigarette, or vaping, product useassociated lung injury (EVALI) across the 50 states, Washington, D.C., and two U.S. territories, including 64 associated deaths across 28 states and Washington, D.C. CDC notes that THC and vitamin E acetate appear to be associated with EVALI, but that there may be more than one cause of the outbreak.
- Action on Smoking and Health <u>published</u> a report analyzing how the tobacco industry influences public policy in the U.S. and recommending ways to combat industry influence.
- Washington University in St. Louis <u>released</u> an online program assessment tool to help tobacco control programs evaluate and improve their

- The University of Maryland Legal Resource Center for Public Health Policy <u>updated</u> its 50state survey of tobacco retailer licensing requirements.
- Nuestras Voces published new <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> language one-pagers on the importance of cervical cancer screening.

State News

 A new campaign in Utah, "The Tobacco Talk," <u>focuses</u> on educating adults on data relating to youth use of flavored tobacco products in the state.

In the News

- On Feb. 6, FDA's <u>policy</u> prohibiting sales of most pod-based e-cigarette flavors <u>went</u> into effect, leaving other flavored e-cigarette products on the market.
- On Feb. 5, executives from the five leading ecigarette manufacturers <u>testified</u> before the House Energy and Commerce Committee, defending their marketing practices amid the youth e-cigarette epidemic.
- The New York Times reports that high school students are <u>transitioning</u> from JUUL to other flavored e-cigarette products that are exempt from FDA regulations.

Research

- A Truth Initiative survey analysis of 15-to-34-yearolds published in *JAMA Pediatrics* <u>concluded</u> that JUUL use increased across all age groups between 2018 and 2019, and was highest among those aged 18 to 20, with 23.9 percent of that age group reported ever using JUUL in 2019.
- A CDC analysis of National Health Interview Survey Data published in *Preventing Chronic Disease* <u>found</u> that between 2000 and 2015, Hispanic adult smokers were consistently less likely to receive cessation advice and use evidencebased cessation methods to quit than non-Hispanic white smokers.
- A randomized controlled trial of people with serious mental illness published in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research found* that telephone outreach calls, mental health tailored phone counseling, and help obtaining nicotine replacement therapy was associated with equal likelihood of making quit attempts and greater cessation success than a control group.
- A *Toxics* laboratory analysis of 38 EVALI caseassociated cannabinoid-containing fluid samples <u>found</u> that 64 percent of the samples contained vitamin E acetate, and that some of the fluids had low cannabinoid content and high concentrations of diluents.
