- FDA is <u>requesting</u> public comments by April 20 to learn more about vaping products associated with lung injuries.
- CDC published the following state policy research findings in *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*:
  - As of Dec. 31, 2018, 15 states <u>covered</u> all nine evidence-based tobacco cessation treatments for Medicaid enrollees.
  - Before a federal tobacco 21 law passed on Dec. 20, 2019, 19 states, Washington, D.C., and two territories

Public Comment Opportunity: Achieving Health Equity in the Advancement of Tobacco had <u>enacted</u> tobacco 21 laws, although some policies contained provisions such as youth purchasing penalties and military exemptions.

- The American Nonsmokers' Rights
   Foundation <u>published</u> a case study about how
   marijuana policy is rolling back clean indoor air
   protections, and <u>released</u> updated state tobacco
   policy maps.
- The National LGBT Cancer Network <u>published</u> a webinar recording that discusses tobacco use disparities in the LGBTQ+ community.
- Rescue Agency recently <u>published</u> materials for <u>Behind the Haze</u>, a new teen vaping prevention campaign.
- CDC reports that, as of Feb. 25, it has identified 2,807 cases of e-cigarette, or vaping, product useassociated lung injury (EVALI) across the 50 states, Washington, D.C., and two U.S. territories, including 68 associated deaths across 29 states and Washington, D.C. CDC announced that this is the final update on national EVALI cases and deaths that it will make due to continuing declines in new cases.

Tobacco Cessation and Lung

- Maryland Comptroller Peter Franchot <u>announced</u> that tobacco retailers in the state are no longer permitted to sell disposable ecigarette products other than tobacco and menthol flavors.
- An Oregon bill that would prohibit the sale of all flavored e-cigarette products has <u>died</u> in the legislature as lawmakers vow to focus on implementing a tobacco retail licensing policy.

# In the News

- The Trump administration's 2021 budget proposal <u>includes</u> a plan to move tobacco product regulation away from FDA and into another newlycreated federal agency under HHS.
- According to the <u>House Committee on Oversight</u> and <u>Reform</u>, JUUL Labs <u>worked</u> directly with at least eight Native American tribes to pitch their product, offering starter kits at deeply discounted prices and portraying the product as a smoking cessation device.
- Associated Press reports that corporate wellness programs designed to encourage smoking cessation among employees oftentimes struggle to be cost-effective.

 An evaluation of the <u>CATCH My Breath</u> youth ecigarette prevention curriculum published in *Public Health Reports* found that at a 16-month follow-up, middle school students who participated in the program were less likely to have ever used ecigarettes and had better e-cigarette knowledge <u>Cancer Screening</u> – American Cancer Society June 3, 1-2 p.m. ET | *Registration required*

## About the Tobacco Control Network

The TCN's mission is to improve the public's health by providing

- A Drug and Alcohol Dependence analysis of adult smokers found that 40 percent of smokers who have never used e-cigarettes most commonly avoid the products because they don't want to substitute one addiction for another, have safety concerns about e-cigarettes, or are skeptical about ecigarettes' utility in smoking cessation.
- A Tobacco Control study identified 219 racing video games released between 1979 and 2018 that contain Marlboro brand imagery, all but one of which is rated "E"—indicating "appropriate for players of all ages"—by the Entertainment Software Ratings Board.
- According to a *Tobacco Control* <u>article</u>, descriptions and photos of the first Philip Morris retail sites located in Atlanta—that sell the IQOS heated tobacco product show that the company is promoting IQOS as "clean" and "high-tech" compared to conventional cigarettes.
