Partner Announcements

- FDA issued a <u>final rule</u> and corresponding <u>submission guidance</u> detailing 11 new health warnings that must appear prominently on cigarette packaging and advertisements beginning June 18, 2021.
- On March 23, CDC <u>launched</u> its renewed Tips from Former Smokers campaign, which highlights smoking-related diseases and stories of family caretakers impacted by loved ones with smokingrelated illness.
- According to the latest CDC <u>Annual Report to the Nation on the Status of Cancer</u>, cancer death rates <u>continued</u> to drop from 2001 to 2017, though Healthy People 2020 targets were not met for cigarette smoking and recent smoking cessation.
- **CDC** published the following research articles:
 - A Morbidity and Mortality Weekly
 Report analysis of lung cancer screening
 data from 10 states found that 12.5% of
 eligible patients were screened for lung
 cancer in the past 12 months.
 - A Preventing Chronic Disease analysis of 2017 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) data concluded that approximately 5% of American adults are current e-cigarette users, 2% are dual users, and 18% are former e-cigarette users.
 - An analysis of e-cigarette, or vaping, product use—associated lung injury (EVALI) data published in Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report details three social clusters in which EVALI was linked to the use of THC-containing vaping products.
- Smoke Free Movies <u>published</u> a new advertisement highlighting the danger that onscreen smoking presents to young people, as well

State News

- New Mexico governor Michelle Lujan
 Grisham <u>signed</u> a series of health bills into law, including one requiring tobacco product retailers, including vape shops, to be licensed and regulated by the state.
- An analysis of 2011-2018 Florida Adult Tobacco Survey data published in *Preventing Chronic* Disease estimates that the Tobacco Free Florida advertising campaign was associated with 332,604 smokers attempting to quit during the seven-year study period.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of smoking data from the California BRFSS concluded that a minimum floor price law, if implemented, would reduce smoking prevalence and total cigarette consumption in the state, especially among those in households below 250% of the federal poverty level.

In the News

 A Reuters article discredits a widely circulated Facebook post claiming that CDC once recommended cigarettes for pregnant women.

Research

- An analysis of advertising expenditure data published in *Tobacco Control* found that annual tobacco advertisement spending decreased from \$133 million in 2014 to \$48 million in 2017, before increasing to \$110 million in 2018.
- A mystery shopper audit of vape shops in six metropolitan areas <u>found</u> that while 95% of shops displayed minimum age signage, just 35.6% asked for age verification upon entry and 23.4% asked for age verification upon product purchase. The findings were published in *Nicotine & Tobacco* Research
- A Tobacco Control meta-analysis of 17 studies on e-cigarette use and subsequent cigarette use in people under age 30 concluded that while there is an association between e-cigarette use in nonsmokers and subsequent cigarette smoking, the strength of this conclusion is limited by reliance on self-reported measures.
