- Action on Smoking and Health <u>published</u> the recording of a webinar on the impact of COVID-19 on the African American community, co-moderated by the African American Tobacco Control Leadership Council.
- Americans for Nonsmokers' Rights
   Foundation celebrated the bars, restaurants, and casinos that are adopting smokefree policies upon reopening after a loosening of local COVID-19 restrictions.
- Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids <u>published</u> a video highlighting the connection between COVID-19 and tobacco use.
- **Trust for America's Health** <u>analyzed</u> the health of America's congressional districts based on 11 preventive health measures, including prevalence of adult tobacco smoking.

# **State News**

- Minnesota Governor Tim Walz signed 11 bills into law, including a bill that raises the purchase age of all tobacco and nicotine products to 21 in concordance with federal law.
- North Carolina <u>published</u> a fact sheet highlighting the relationship between tobacco use and COVID-19, as well as resources to help tobacco users quit.
- An American Heart Association success story <u>details</u> how **Colorado** repealed its tobacco preemption policy in March 2019, allowing for dozens of local tobacco regulation campaigns and tax increase proposals.

The Association of State and Territorial Health Officials is the national nonprofit association representing the state and territorial public health agencies of the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the District of Columbia, ASTHO members, the chief health officials of these jurisdictions, are dedicated to formulating and influencing sound public health policy and to ensuring excellence in state-based public health practice.



- Oakland, California closed a loophole that allowed adult-only tobacco retailers to sell flavored tobacco products, meaning that the products are now completely prohibited within the city.
- Maryland Governor Larry Hogan <u>vetoed</u> a bill that would have raised cigarette taxes, established a tax on nicotine vaping systems, and established the nation's first tax on digital advertising. The state legislature can vote to override the governor's veto.

# In the News

- FDA and four tobacco manufacturers <u>filed</u> a joint motion to extend the deadline to display FDA-mandated graphic warning labels on cigarette packaging and advertisements by 120 days to Oct. 16, 2021, citing disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. This follows an earlier motion filed by tobacco companies requesting an injunction on implementing the required labels, claiming a violation of the First Amendment.
- Nationwide cigarette sales <u>rose</u> by 1.1% for the week ending March 22, as many governors issued stay-at-home orders in response to COVID-19, before an 8.4% decline in early April.

# Research

 A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of National Youth Tobacco Survey data from 2011 to 2018 <u>concluded</u> that the proportion of youth smokers who smoke menthols declined from 57.3% to 45.7%, with no change observed among several sociodemographic groups including non-Hispanic black and Hispanic youth smokers.

- A JAMA Pediatrics comparison of adolescent and adult cases of e-cigarette product use-associated lung injury <u>found</u> that adolescents were more likely to obtain vaping products from informal sources and report certain symptoms, such as attentiondeficit/hyperactivity disorder.
- A model published in *Tobacco Control* <u>estimated</u> that a sustained 10-year national antitobacco media campaign would result in net societal savings of \$10.4 billion by reducing adult cigarette smoking prevalence by 1.2%.
