State News

 The Georgia House voted 123-33 to pass a bill regulating and taxing vaping products the same way combustible tobacco products are regulated, but has not yet considered a proposal that would increase the cigarette tax from \$0.37 per pack to \$1.35.

In the News


- The Quit Because of COVID-19 Act, which will ensure coverage of approved tobacco cessation treatments for all Medicaid beneficiaries, was <u>introduced</u> in the U.S. House of Representatives and earned the support of several national public health groups.
- Tobacco tax increases are one of many policy options that cities and states around the country are <u>considering</u> to increase public revenues in response to budget shortfalls brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The U.S. Federal Reserve <u>bought</u> \$428 million in company bonds this year through mid-June, including from Philip Morris International Inc.
- The top three tobacco product manufacturers recently <u>raised</u> the price of their cigarettes, while R.J. Reynolds introduced two new varieties of Newport cigarettes to improve sales figures amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

Research

- A CDC MMWR study of eight cases of EVALI reported to the California Department of Public Health in April <u>concluded</u> that seven of the patients tested positive for THC use, and that healthcare providers should continue to maintain clinical suspicion for EVALI after ruling out COVID-19.
- A population model published in *Tobacco Control* <u>predicted</u> that under the status quo, 305 million life-years will be lost relating to smoking in the United States between 2018 and 2100, compared to 191.8 million life-years lost if all smoking ceased at the end of 2017.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research smoking cessation study found that smokers reporting co-occurring pain were less likely to initiate a quit attempt or achieve seven-day abstinence compared to smokers who didn't report pain during the study period.
- A study of adult smokers published in *Health Psychology* <u>concluded</u> that adult smokers with greater numeracy demonstrated a greater memory of risk probabilities associated with smoking, a factor understood to be associated with greater risk perception, quit intentions, and successful cessation.

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
