 A Nicotine & Tobacco Research study of 121 vape shops in southern California found that 88% of surveyed vape shop employees indicated that they provided smoking cessation advice to customers, with 45% of all employees surveyed reporting no vaping-related research knowledge.

A communication published in Tobacco
 Control makes the argument for "endgame" policies
 that phase out the sale of cigarettes, noting the

Research

- A Tobacco Control data analysis concluded that the 2014 CVS Health policy to cease tobacco product sales in its 7,700 stores nationwide is associated with a reduction of cigarettes smoked by non-daily smokers, with greater reductions observed in areas with a greater CVS market share.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of survey data <u>found</u> that between 2000 and 2018, despite overall declines, prevalence of adolescent nonmedical amphetamine, tranquillizer, and opioid use

- did not change substantially within groups of ever and never cigarette smokers, supporting the "gateway" hypothesis of youth tobacco use.
- A survey of young adult students who reported going to bars or nightclubs published in *Tobacco Control* <u>concluded</u> that increased exposure to free samples of tobacco products in those venues was positively correlated with tobacco product use among non-users.
