- The following announcements come from **CDC**:
 - O A CDC MMWR analysis of 2020 National Youth Tobacco Survey data concluded that 19.6% of high school students and 4.7% of middle school students reported past 30-day e-cigarette use, indicating that 1.8 million fewer youth were current e-cigarette users than in 2019. FDA published a summary of this research, complete with infographics.
 - CDC <u>published</u> a feature article that discusses how smokers interested in quitting as a New Year's resolution can use cessation medications to improve their chances of succeeding.
 - CDC <u>updated</u> the resources available on the PLACES Project website, which includes an interactive map feature with lots of integrated health data originally developed as part of the 500 Cities Project.
 - Host sites can <u>apply</u> to the CDC's Public Health Associate Program by Feb. 16.
- A letter from the National Native Network to the tobacco control program managers <u>outlines</u> opportunities for tobacco control programs to partner with the agency to reduce tobacco use burdens experienced by American Indian and Alaska Native populations.
- The following announcements come from Truth Initiative:

 report <u>overviews</u> how young people
 unfavorably view the tobacco industry and
 support greater regulation on tobacco

The TCN is a network of tobacco program managers and staff from state and territorial health departments as well as Funder's Alliance organizations,

- To continue its partnership with Scholastic to develop e-cigarette prevention materials for schoolaged youth, FDA launched a "Vaping's Not My Thing" student poster submission contest and published a blog post to help parents and teachers be aware of the latest disguisable ecigarette products.
- A summary from Americans for Nonsmokers
 Rights overviews progress towards smokefree air
 for all, such as in states that closed casino
 loopholes, and challenges to smokefree air in 2021,
 which include legalized recreational cannabis and
 preemption.

State News

- Julie Bisbee, executive director of the Oklahoma Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust, wrote a guest column discussing how preemption is an obstacle to passing local-level policies that protect Oklahomans from the harms of tobacco use.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of cigarette sales data found that after Hawaii implemented a tobacco 21 law in June 2016, average monthly cigarette unit sales dropped 4.4%.
- A simulation study published in *Tobacco*Control concluded that a restriction of tobacco retail outlet advertising within 1000 feet of schools in the four largest **Texas** metropolitan areas would result in a 19.4% reduction in students' tobacco advertisement exposure.

 A Tobacco Control editorial <u>awarded</u> a failing grade to the United States for the tobacco warning systems currently in place.

Research

- A Nicotine & Tobacco
 Research commentary <u>overviews</u> the current state
 of the evidence on tobacco product use and
 COVID-19.
- An analysis of 2015 to 2019 cigarette sales data
 published in *Tobacco Control* found that the sales
 of brands more preferred by consumers under age
 21 declined after the implementation of local
 tobacco 21 laws in a pattern 99% better explained
 than by placebo models.
- A longitudinal study published in Nicotine &
 Tobacco Research concluded that compared to
 tobacco product non-users, e-cigarette use is
 associated with increased exposure to tobacco related toxicants that are themselves associated
 with increased risk of respiratory symptoms.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research commentary authored by CDC researchers overviews the evidence-based approach used to respond to the 2019 EVALI outbreak, and discusses future opportunities for research and public health practice.

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
