Partner Announcements

- The following announcements come from FDA:
 - On Jan. 15, FDA <u>issued</u> 10 warning letters to e-cigarette manufacturers for illegally selling their products without submitting a premarket tobacco product application by the Sept. 2020 deadline.
 - FDA announced that as a result of a federal court ruling, it will delay the effective date for updated cigarette warning labels by 90 days to Jan. 14, 2022
 - An FDA press release <u>details</u> how the agency worked with U.S. Customs and Border Protection to seize over 33,000 units of counterfeit e-cigarettes.
 - o FDA published two final rules in the Federal Register that detail <u>premarket</u> tobacco product applications and recordkeeping requirements and the content and format of substantial equivalence reports.
- The following announcements come from CDC:
 - A JAMA editorial authored by CDC/OSH leadership describes a comprehensive approach to encourage adult tobacco cessation, noting new recommendations from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force and recommending systems level

- An estimate on the cost effectiveness of CDC's Tips from Former Smokers campaign published in *American Journal of Preventive Medicine* concluded that from 2012 to 2018, the campaign was associated with an estimated 129,100 premature deaths avoided and \$7.3 billion in healthcare savings.
- NACDD <u>announced</u> its presidents challenge of racial equity through chronic disease prevention, complete with proposed action steps and a oneyear strategic map.
- Truth Initiative <u>published</u> a 2021 quit-smoking calendar and tip sheet as part of its EX smoking cessation program.
- HHS published listings of <u>leading health</u> <u>indicators</u> and <u>overall health and well-being</u> <u>measures</u> as part of its rollout of <u>Healthy People</u> 2030.

State News

- An Action on Smoking and Health press release <u>congratulates</u> Beverly Hills and Manhattan Beach, **California** for, as of Jan. 1, being the first two jurisdictions to have policies in effect that prohibit the sale of all tobacco products.
- A Tobacco Control longitudinal study of young adult cigarette smokers at 24 Texas colleges found that 33.7% of smoking students were dual product users, 25.6% were poly (three or more) product users, and that menthol was associated with 1.28 times greater odds of being a multiple tobacco product user.

In the News

• An article on the biomedical ethics of e-cigarette sales published in *Nicotine & Tobacco* Research argues that e-cigarettes should be made available to adult cigarette smokers as a harm reduction option when coupled with policies that disincentivize youth use.

Research

- An ongoing cross-sectional survey published in Tobacco Control concluded that EVALI awareness among 15- to 24-year-olds was positively associated with perceived risk of lung injury and other harm perceptions tied to e-cigarette use.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of tweets
 with the phrase "flavors save lives" found that those
 advocating against tobacco flavor policies most
 frequently included themes of political referendums
 (76.5%) and institutional distrust (31.3%).
- A study of cigarette advertising tactics published in Nicotine & Tobacco Research concluded that sweepstakes offers and natural/outdoor/environmental themes were associated with increased product appeal among the study sample of 13- to 24-year-olds.
