Tobacco Treatment Best Practices Training Deadline: March 15

OK would like to help its partners locate examples of tobacco treatment best practices training that provides continuing medical education credits for MDs, nurses, respiratory therapists, and social workers. Evaluating Program Funding Reduction Deadline: March 16

KY has had a Master Settlement Agreement funding reduction. In the past, they gave a base allocation to every local health department in the state for tobacco control work, but starting in FY22 they are only going to fund 19 of 61 local health departments. They are interested in measuring and understanding what, if any, impact that funding reduction is going to have on local tobacco control efforts in KY.

- CDC made the following announcements:
 - CDC <u>released</u> new advertisements and participants as part of its Tips from Former Smokers campaign, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary.
 - An *MMWR* analysis of National Health Interview Survey data <u>found</u> that during 2017 and 2018, approximately 3.4% of U.S. workers used ecigarettes, with use most common in the accommodation and food service industries.
- National Behavioral Health Network <u>published</u> a comprehensive implementation toolkit to help state tobacco control programs identify and address health disparities tied to tobacco use among individuals with behavioral health and

- The American Cancer Society <u>published</u> its annual comprehensive Cancer Facts and Figures report, which once again identifies tobacco use as an important risk factor that must be addressed to continue reducing cancer incidence and mortality.
- A highlight of the Geographic Health Equity
 Alliance and Counter Tools geographic surveillance
 learning collaborative <u>features</u> a brief summary and tobacco
 data mapping example from three participating states.
- The following announcements come from FDA:
 - Former FDA Secretary Stephen Hahn <u>published</u> an overview of FDA's contributions to public health in 2020, including a synopsis of tobacco product regulations.
 - FDA <u>announced</u> that it sent an additional 18 warning letters to e-cigarette manufacturers for illegally marketing products without submitting the required premarket tobacco product applications.

State News

- The Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth <u>updated</u> its event calendar with several virtual events taking place as part of their empowerment series taking place March 10-25.
- The **North Carolina** tobacco control program <u>published</u> a two-page factsheet detailing findings from its 2019 Youth Tobacco Survey.
- An Addictive Behaviors analysis of data from 4,201 students attending 24 Texas colleges found that participants were exposed to an average of 43 little cigar and cigarillo (LCC) marketing materials per week, and that marketing exposure was positively associated with odds of both current LCC use and current cigarette use.
- A *Tobacco Control* analysis of flavored cigarillo product availability after a Providence, **Rhode Island** law prohibiting characterizing flavors (but exempting mint and menthol) took effect <u>found</u> that the availability of newly prohibited products decreased significantly more in Providence than in the rest of the state.

In the News

• A supplement in the March 2021 publication of the *American Journal of Preventive Medicine* <u>features</u> 12 articles exploring the role of quitlines in tobacco cessation.

Research

- An experiment involving Black and/or sexual and gender minority young adults published in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research found* that relative to a control group of nontargeted ads, targeted anti-smoking advertisements increased motivation and beliefs, but decreased policy support.
- A *Tobacco Control* analysis of Google shopping queries during the height of the EVALI outbreak (July 2019 to February 2020) <u>concluded</u> that while vape shopping and JUUL shopping queries were 34% and 39% lower than expected, respectively, IQOS shopping queries were 58% higher than expected.
