- Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, with support from several partner organizations, <u>published</u> a report detailing the tobacco industry's predatory marketing of women and girls, and the resulting health consequences of female tobacco product use in the United States.
- SAMHSA <u>released</u> a comprehensive guide discussing evidence-based strategies to reduce ecigarette use among youth and young adults.

Partnering to Close the Gaps

- National Native Network <u>updated</u> its Commercial Tobacco Smoke-Free Tribal Policy Toolkit, now in its fourth edition, to help American Indian and Alaskan Native communities implement smoke-free policies.
- The Geographic Health Equity Alliance <u>published</u> a video presentation and accompanying article overviewing evidence-based strategies to involve youth in tobacco control work.
- FDA <u>announced</u> a 60-day public comment period for its <u>draft guidance</u>, *Tobacco Product User Fees: Responses to Frequently Asked Questions*, with comments being accepted until July 26.

## **State News**

- A new Alabama policy <u>raises</u> the minimum purchase, possession, and transportation ages of all tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, from 19 to 21.
- Montana Governor Greg Gianforte <u>signed</u> a bill into law that increases the cost of tobacco retail licenses while prohibiting local jurisdictions to pass any bills that restrict the sale of e-cigarette products or other emerging tobacco products.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of a Facebook group designed to reduce barriers to successful cessation in Alaska Native communities <u>concluded</u> that this culturally tailored approach can serve as a model for other communities.
- A web-based experiment of southern California young adults published in *Tobacco Control* found that modified risk claims may help persuade young people that heated

National Conference on <u>Tobacco or Health</u> – National Network of Public Health Institutes New Orleans tobacco products are less harmful than cigarettes without making them more appealing.

## In the News

 An editorial published in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research* <u>argues</u> that racism is a key determinant in explaining tobacco-related health disparities, and that the ongoing focus of race as a determinant represents a barrier to achieving health equity.

## Research

- An analysis of emerging tobacco-free nicotine pouch products published in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research concluded* that these products are almost always flavored, and that they vary significantly in moisture content, alkalinity, and nicotine content.
- A randomized control trial of the Truth Initiative This is Quitting text-based e-cigarette cessation program published in JAMA Internal Medicine found that 24.1% of young adult e-cigarette users enrolled in the program abstained from those products at seven-month follow-up, compared to 18.6% of a control group, a statistically significant difference.
- An industry analysis published in *Tobacco Control found* that while JUUL Labs was executing a well-publicized \$30 million campaign to combat underage use of its product, it spent \$66.2 million across two years on corporate responsibility advertising.
