In the News

- The Navajo Nation Council <u>passed</u> the Air is Life Act of 2021, a comprehensive commercial tobacco smoke-free policy in workplaces, tribal casinos, and other public spaces.
- JAMA Oncology reports that smoking cessation at a younger age can substantially avert smokingassociated cancer mortality risk among younger individuals.

Research

- Nicotine & Tobacco Research published a tobacco use treatment experiment involving American Indian and Alaska Natives <u>concluded</u> that a smartphone cessation application based on Acceptance and Commitment Therapy is effective at encouraging participants to quit tobacco use.
- An online experiment of young adults aged 18 to 29 published in *Tobacco Control found* that participants who viewed Puff Bar advertisements that include the company's "tobacco-free nicotine" claim reported higher intentions of using the product and reported being less likely to view the product as harmful.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of FDA tobacco retailer compliance checks from 2015 – 2019 <u>found</u> that a propensity score model was able to predict retail violations, indicating that a model-based approach can be used to identify hot spots of retail violations.
