# **Partner Announcements**

- In a recent summary
  report, CDC <u>published</u> scientific evidence on the
  public health burden and economic impact of
  secondhand exposure to commercial tobacco
  smoke and population-level, evidenced-based
  strategies to prevent these harms.
- The following announcements come from Truth Initiative:
  - Truth Initiative's fourth annual Nicotine on Demand report found that 60% of 2020's top 15 streaming shows among 15-to-24year-olds depict tobacco, with more pervasive smoking and vaping imagery present on-screen than ever before.
  - A recent Truth Initiative survey <u>concluded</u> that nearly half of surveyed 15-to-24-year-olds who vape consider trying to quit vaping as a New Year's resolution.

- The Nebraska legislature is considering LB954, which would preempt local jurisdictions from passing their own clean air legislation relating to the use e-cigarette products.
- New Zealand <u>plans</u> to introduce Tobacco-Free Generation legislation nationwide, based on the example implemented by Brookline, **Massachusetts** this past year which prohibits the sale of tobacco products to anyone born after Jan. 1, 2000.

## In the News

 A New York Times article <u>depicts</u> the reappearance of smoking and increase in cigarette sales across New York City due to potential explanations of continued feelings of stress and engagement in outdoor nightlife as pandemic restrictions eased.

#### Research

- An American Journal of Health Promotion analysis
  of academic grades and positive health behaviors
  from the 2017 Youth Risk Behavior
  Survey found that students who reported receiving
  mostly A's had two more positive health behaviors,
  compared to students who reported mostly D's/F's.
- A Tobacco Control research article illustrates that
  disposable e-cigarette brands are undertaking
  measures to escape tobacco regulation and flavor
  limitations via post-market flavor additions to
  unflavored nicotine e-liquid, with fruit flavors
  comprising 82.2% of the flavor varieties among Puff

- A review in Nicotine & Tobacco Research of 31
   articles reporting the investigation of perceived
   barriers and enablers to supporting smoking
   cessation in mental health settings, identified 56
   barriers/enablers from the perspectives of mental
   healthcare professionals (MHPs) and 48 from
   patient perspectives, including MHPs' lack of time
   and ill-informed interaction around smoking.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of cigarette marketing expenditure data from Federal Trade Commission cigarette reports <u>found</u> that tobacco companies spent the most on promotional allowances, coupons, and retail-value-added bonuses from 1988-2003, with retail expenditures comprising 98% of cigarette marketing expenditures in 2019.
