- CDC released a new round of ads for the Tips From Former Smokers campaign, which will run through September 25. The campaign will promote text messaging services designed to connect adults with support to help quit smoking.
- American Lung Association <u>published</u> its Addressing Tobacco Use in Black Communities Toolkit which features a variety of resources to build authentic community partnerships and lead sustainable tobacco control programs to improve health equity among Black Americans.
- National LGBT Cancer Network <u>launched</u> Outlast Tobacco, an LGBTQ+ cessation quitline portal designed to provide community-specific motivation and encouragement to LGBTQ+ people who use tobacco products.
- •
- FDA <u>released</u> a webinar on the agency's plans to advance two tobacco product standards: one to prohibit menthol as a characterizing flavor in cigarettes and another to prohibit characterizing flavors, except tobacco, in cigars.

## **Funding Opportunities**

2022 Community Engagement Activity Award – African American Tobacco Control Leadership Council Awards of up to \$3,500 will be offered to six organizations who are working to improve the health of the Black community and want to integrate commercial tobacco control activities into their tax increases to keep prices high and reduce disparities.

- YouCanQuit2 provides service members and others with resources and programs to meet a variety of tobacco cessation needs through its Support Locator. The tool allows individuals to filter results by geographic location, Military Base, Military Service, and type of tobacco product.
- ChangeLab Solutions, in partnership with Counter Tools, <u>published</u> a playbook to equip tobacco prevention staff with knowledge and resources on the different forms preemption can take, legal considerations for determining local authority, and strategies communities across the country are using to make progress despite preemption at the point-of-sale.

## **State News**

- The San Leandro City Council in California unanimously <u>approved</u> a ban on the sale of menthol cigarettes, which will take effect in January 2023.
- Rescue Agency <u>released</u> initial findings from Quit the Hit, an Instagram-based, moderator-led cessation education program, in **South Carolina** to supplement existing cessation support for teens and young adults.
- The Wisconsin Assembly <u>passed</u> a bill which would bring the state into compliance with federal law and raise the minimum age for purchasing tobacco and vaping products from 18 to 21.
- S.B. 1284, an effort to raise the legal tobacco purchasing age to 21 in Idaho, passed the Senate on a 19-15 vote.

## Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of state and local flavored tobacco product sales restrictions, <u>found</u> the comprehensiveness of sales restrictions in the United States varies widely, with most state-level policies (71.4%) categorized in the second-lowest comprehensiveness category.
- A recent Cancer Prevention Research article examined tobacco treatment perceptions among Black and non-Black patients attending lung cancer screenings who currently smoke cigarettes. The analysis reported that Black patients were less likely to report concerns about withdrawal symptoms and more likely to report smoking less now and perceiving no need to quit.
- A Nicotine and Tobacco Research analysis of U.S. e-cigarette users with distinguished types of vaping motives (e.g., health, socialization, and dependence), <u>found</u> that heightened risk perception of e-cigarette users' vulnerability to COVID-19 was inversely associated with use intensity and health motives for vaping.


## About the Tobacco Control Network
