among students in grades 9-12 than prescription opioid misuse (4.3%), current cigarette smoking (3.3%), cigar-smoking (2.3%), and smokeless tobacco use (1.9%) from January-June 2021.

- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - After concluding that the likely benefit for adult smokers who significantly reduce their cigarette use outweighs the risk to youth, FDA <u>authorized</u> several tobaccoflavored ENDS products from Logic Technology Development LLC under the Logic Vapeleaf, Logic Power, and Logic Pro brands.
 - FDA <u>issued</u> marketing denial orders to Fontem US, LLC for several myblu ENDS products after determining their applications lacked sufficient evidence that permitting marketing of these products would be appropriate for the protection of public health.
- Truth Initiative shares that eight of the 10 films nominated for Best Picture at the 2022 Oscars and more than half (61%) of all this year's Oscarnominated feature films contain tobacco imagery, reinforcing the glamorization of tobacco use in entertainment media and pop culture.
- ChangeLab Solutions released a collection of downloadable resources on evidence-informed messaging to help frame communication efforts on tobacco-related health disparities in ways that center on justice and social context.

- The Houston City Council
 in Texas unanimously <u>approved</u> a ban on the use
 of electronic smoking products in the same areas
 that ban regular cigarettes, effective immediately.
- An International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health analysis of a New York state survey of residents in five public housing authorities reported evidence that implementation of a rule prohibiting the use of cigarettes, cigars, pipes, and water pipes in all federally subsidized public housing resulted in policy compliance, reduced secondhand smoke incursions, and lowered reported smoking rates.

In the News

• The Washington Post released a podcast sponsored by Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, in which Georges Benjamin, executive director of APHA, and Keith Wailoo, professor at Princeton University, explore the tobacco industry's concerted efforts to target African Americans with menthol cigarettes and the FDA's impending ban on the product.

Research

An American Journal of
 Preventive Medicine analysis of trends in seven
 FDA-approved prescription smoking cessation
 medications during 2009–2019 found that total
 spending per fill increased by 80% (from \$157 to \$282), whereas patient spending per fill decreased by 75% (from \$47 to \$12).

- A Preventive Medicine Reports analysis of 2014—2019 Monitoring the Future data reported that Tobacco 21 coverage was associated with a lower likelihood of smoking participation among 12th graders, Hispanic and other/multiracial individuals, those with parents who have less than a college education, and those who were not definitely planning on attending college.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of survey data of 1,000 adolescents found that adolescents were more likely to be receptive to cigarette ads with flora imagery.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of e-cigarette
 advertisements coded for the presence of
 flavors reported that following the 2020 FDA flavor
 guidance, the relative proportion of mentholflavored e-cigarette advertisements sent via email
 significantly increased from 22.5% to 52.2%.
