Partner Announcements

- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - FDA <u>announced</u> proposed product standards to prohibit menthol as a characterizing flavor in cigarettes and prohibit all characterizing flavors (other than tobacco) in cigars.
 - The public may provide comments on proposed rules prohibiting menthol cigarettes and flavored cigars through July
 5.
 - Mitch Zeller, director of the Center for Tobacco Products, <u>reflects</u> on his nineyear tenure leading FDA's efforts to reduce disease and death from tobacco use.
 - FDA <u>issued</u> marketing granted orders to NJOY LLC for its Ace closed e-cigarette device and three accompanying tobaccoflavored e-liquid pods.
- The following announcements are from Truth Initiative:
 - Truth Initiative <u>launched</u> Vaping: Know the truth, a free national youth vaping prevention curriculum which gives young people the facts about e-cigarette use and provides resources to quit, alongside the This is Quitting initiative, a first-of-its-kind text message program.
 - Truth Initiative researchers found that tobacco stores in Washington, D.C. neighborhoods with higher percentages of Black residents had more marketing for flavored tobacco products compared to neighborhoods with lower percentages of Black residents.

Funding Opportunities

- As stress, anxiety, and depression have shown to improve within 2 weeks of tobacco use cessation, the EX Program is <u>encouraging</u> workplaces to address smoking stigma in addition to mental health.
- Public Health Law Center released its Tobacco
 Product Waste Toolkit intended for communities
 that already license and regulate the sale of
 commercial tobacco products and are ready to
 address tobacco product waste through education,
 advocacy, and, ultimately, policy change.
- The Center for Black Health & Equity released a
 podcast episode in which host Natasha Phelps
 provides an update on FDA's announcement to ban
 menthol in tobacco products and covers how No
 Menthol Sunday is a helpful tool to get others
 involved in the fight against tobacco addiction.
- National Behavioral Health Network shares an implementation brief which provides information on how to develop a state tobacco use baseline for individuals with mental health and/or substance use challenges and implement actionable plans.

State News

- The Alaska Senate <u>passed</u> a bill to raise the legal age to buy and sell tobacco products to 21.
- The San Diego City Council in California voted 7-2 to implement the Stop Adolescent Addiction to Flavored E-Cigarettes (SAAFE) ordinance which bans the sale of flavored tobacco products, effective Jan. 1, 2023.
- A study in the Journal of Prevention found that a cardiovascular disease risk reduction intervention improved rates of tobacco screening and cessation

In the News

A Los Angeles Times article <u>overviews</u> how the tobacco industry framed the prohibition of menthol cigarettes, the flavor of choice for the vast majority of Black smokers, as a policy that would increase policing in Black communities and create a new layer of racism in America.

Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of a randomized switching trial <u>found</u> that the use of both menthol and non-menthol e-cigarettes was associated with high rates of use and acceptability among menthol cigarette smokers.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of Wave 3 of the Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health reported that non-Hispanic Black and Hispanic smokers, as well as those making under \$10,000 a year had significantly higher than average prevalence of the misperception that nicotine causes cancer.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of the
 Truth Initiative Young Adult Cohort found that
 among Non-Hispanic White young adults, having
 fewer peers who smoke cigarettes is protective
 against any tobacco initiation, whereas among
 Hispanic young adults, being female and perceiving
 tobacco as harmful are protective.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of data from a randomized controlled trial involving
