## In the News

- A study recently published in the scientific journal PLOS
   One is the first study concluding that those who vape, <u>as well</u> as those who smoke, have worse COVID-19 outcomes than non-users. People who reported using tobacco products prior to their hospitalization were 39% more likely to be put on mechanical ventilation than non-smokers and 45% more likely to die.
- Elizabeth Tracey, director of electronic media for Johns
  Hopkins Medicine, and Rick Lange, president of the Texas
  Tech University Health Sciences Center, discuss the efficacy
  of varenicline, a smoking cessation medication, added to
  counseling on smoking cessation among African American
  daily smokers.

## Research

- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of the U.S.
   Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health survey
   data from 2013 to 2019 concluded that compared to non-use, exclusive cigarette use was associated with an increased risk of self-reported incident diagnosed cardiovascular disease, while ENDS use was not associated with a statistically significant increase in the outcomes.
- An American Journal of Preventive Medicine analysis of a combination of data sources concluded that the estimated total cost of morbidity-related productivity losses attributable to cigarette smoking in the United States in 2018 was \$184.9
