- The 2021 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data set is <u>now publicly available</u>.
- The following announcements are from **FDA**:
 - Brian King, director for Center for Tobacco Products, shares plans to combat youth vaping and build a strong foundation for the protection of public health through tobacco regulation.
 - FDA announced the launch of its <u>Vaping</u> <u>Prevention and Education Resource</u> <u>Center</u>, an online resource center which provides science-based, standards- mapped materials that teachers can use to help students understand the dangers associated with vaping and nicotine addiction.
 - As of Sept. 6, FDA has issued <u>a total of 44</u> <u>warning letters</u> to manufacturers and over 300 warning letters to retailers for

- FDA released a <u>new Tobacco Compliance</u> <u>webinar</u>, "Tobacco Entries: Updated Information for Filing ENDS Products for Import in the Automated Commercial Environment," which provides members of the import trade community important updates and reminders about filing electronic nicotine delivery systems entries in the Automated Commercial Environment.
- NACCHO <u>released a report</u> on the state of tobacco control and prevention programs at local health departments, using data from the <u>2019 NACCHO</u> <u>Profile Study</u> and the <u>2018 Forces of Change</u> <u>Report</u>.
- The following announcements are from **Truth** Initiative:
 - A new analysis from Truth Initiative shows the <u>high cost of the FDA's inaction</u>, estimating that nearly 2.5 million youth and young adults (15-24 years old) have started using e-cigarettes for the first time following the missed deadline.
 - According to new research co-authored by Truth Initiative, popular nicotine pouch brands On!, Zyn, and Velo <u>spent nearly</u> <u>\$25 million on ads</u> between January 2019 and September 2021, and built on marketing methods that helped recruit a generation of young people to new nicotine-containing products like ecigarettes.

Funding Opportunities

Tobacco/Vape-Free College Grant – Truth Initiative This program is offering up to \$20,000 to colleges and universities to support the adoption and implementation of a 100% tobacco- and vapefree campus policy. All colleges and universities that do not already have a 100% tobacco/vape-free policy are eligible to apply. **Deadline:** Oct, 12

- American Academy of Pediatrics, with funding from the American Heart Association, is providing trainings for school health personnel on identifying youth tobacco use and supporting cessation. The trainings adapt the <u>AAP "Ask – Counsel – Treat"</u> <u>cessation counseling model</u> into an educational curriculum for school nurses and other school health personnel. State News

- Alaska's governor <u>vetoed a bill</u> that would have raised the minimum age to purchase and legally possess tobacco products from 19 to 21 years old and increased tax on e-cigarettes.
- The Miami Beach City Commission in Florida voted to ban cigarette smoking and other tobacco products on the city's public beaches and public parks.
- A JAMA Network analysis of state-level data on monthly aggregate cigarette sales volumes released for consumption from January 2017 to June 2021 found that monthly cigarette sales per 1000 persons decreased in Massachusetts by 350.02 packs and increased in bordering states by 9.51 packs, following the implementation of the comprehensive menthol flavor ban.

This program is offering a \$1,000 award (for approximately 10 hours of participation) to five youthserving organizations and/or schools who are interested in advocacy, and willing to introduce youth to tobacco prevention work with a social justice lens. **Deadline:** Ongoing basis until April 30, 2023.

In the News

- Juul Labs sued the FDA over the agency's refusal to disclose documents supporting its order banning the company from selling e-cigarettes on the U.S. market.
- E-cigarette company Juul will pay <u>\$438.5 million to</u> <u>34 states and territories</u> in a settlement following a two-year investigation into the company's marketing and sales practices.

Research

- An American Journal of Obstetrics & Gynecology analysis of state-level live birth data and county-level municipal smoke-free legislation status concluded that pregnant persons living in counties with comprehensive laws were 9% less likely to have a preterm birth, compared to those living in counties without a smoke-free ordinance.
- An International Journal of Cancer analysis

 of cigarette smoking-attributable cancer deaths and
 associated PYLL among individuals aged 25 79 years in 2019 concluded that states with the
 highest overall age-standardized PYLL and lost
 earning rates were in the South and Midwest, with
 the estimated rate for PYLL per 100,000 population
 ranging from 352 in Utah to 1337 in West Virginia,
 and lost earnings ranging from \$4.3 million in Idaho
 to \$14.8 million in Missouri.
- A Tobacco Control analysis concluded that <u>cigarettes per day (CPD) significantly</u> <u>decreased</u> and IQOS use significantly increased, as did the percentage IQOS HeatSticks that replaced CPD for adult, daily, non-treatment-seeking cigarette smokers newly introduced to IQOS.

 A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of electronic health record data from 104,590 COVID-19 patients hospitalized from Feb. 1, 2020 to Sept. 30, 2021 found that <u>vaccination was more strongly</u> <u>associated with reduced mortality</u> among current and former smokers than for never smokers. Among current smokers, NRT prescription was associated with reduced mortality.
