<u>Tobacco/Vape-Free College</u> <u>Grant</u> – Truth Initiative This program is offering up to FDA announced the availability of its <u>redesigned</u> <u>digital age verification calendar</u> as part of the "This is Our Watch" voluntary retailer education program. Once shared with retailers across the United States through a direct-mail initiative, the calendars will now be available for order via our Tobacco Education Resource Library.

The following announcements are from Truth Initiative:

- Truth Initiative provides an in-depth timeline which uncovers why e-cigarettes staying on the market for years <u>without undergoing a full review</u> of their public health impact puts a new generation at risk for nicotine addiction.
- With the head-to-toe impact of tobacco use on employee health, the EX Program explains why it's critical <u>that employers of all sizes approach tobacco</u> <u>cessation</u> as a core offering.
- According to a Truth Initiative and University of Kentucky Markey Cancer Center commentary in *Preventive Medicine*, tobacco control researchers should <u>consider equity throughout the policymaking</u> <u>process</u> to ensure flavored tobacco policies are effective.

Due to an overwhelming demand from attendees of the first two of their Lung Cancer Disparities webinars, **SelfMade Health Network** <u>has made access available to presentation</u> <u>slides</u> in the "Supplemental Materials" and "Certificate of Attendance" sections.

The **National Behavioral Health Network** published the recording for its webinar, <u>Journey to a Tobacco-free Certified</u> <u>Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC): A</u> <u>Conversation</u>, which features two CCBHC leaders who shared the steps they took to implement a comprehensive tobacco free policy within their organizations.

About the Tobacco Control Network

The TCN's mission is to improve the public's

- The City of Chula Vista in California voted unanimously to <u>ban the sale of flavored tobacco</u> <u>products</u>, which will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2023.
- A judge in Washington County, Oregon <u>ruled</u> against the county's ban on flavored tobacco products, saying it is unenforceable and preempted by state law.

In the News

- Reynolds Trust announced that it will <u>divest itself of</u> <u>tobacco interests</u> to better perform their mission to improve communities' health.
- Marlboro maker Altria disclosed that it had <u>ended</u> <u>its noncompete agreement with Juul Labs</u> Inc., nearly four years after buying a 35% stake in the ecigarette maker.

Research

- An analysis of 2019 National Health Survey data published in CDC's *Preventing Chronic Disease* concluded that <u>a significant decrease</u> <u>occurred in current cigarette smoking</u> among adults aged 45 to 64 years with diabetes during 2010-2019. However, smoking prevalence remains high and relatively unchanged among people with chronic diseases associated with smoking.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of the variation in the minimum legal sales age of tobacco products over time and across counties in the United States from 2014-2018 found that 50.5% of potential smokers in the study population would have been prevented from smoking during the first trimester if the law prevented selling tobacco products to them in the locality they live.

health by providing education and statebased expertise to tobacco prevention and control at the state and national levels.

- A literature review published in Nicotine & Tobacco Research concluded that the risk of offspring overweight and obesity was moderately higher for quitters during pregnancy compared to nonsmokers, although it might not be as high as continued smokers.
 - According to *Nicotine & Tobacco Research*, a randomized controlled trial in which levels of menthol and nicotine in cigarettes were <u>manipulated using experimental</u> <u>cigarettes</u> found that after an initial increase, rates of smoking of all experimental cigarettes were at or below baseline rates of smoking of one's own brand.
