 consumers, allowing corporations to effectively
 avoid regulation and to promote products that
 undermine our health and drive or worsen
 inequities.

State News

- The Nashville City Council
 in Tennessee passed an ordinance to prohibit
 smoking in businesses limited to ages 21+,
 effectively prohibiting smoking in bars. The law will
 go into effect March 1, 2023.
- NYC Health Department released a new report emphasizing the need to address the root causes of smoking inequities, with recommendations on how to make progress.
- The citywide restriction of tobacco product sales in Brookline, Massachusetts to anyone born after Jan. 1, 2000, is in effect, following the

In the News

 HealthDay overviews the <u>significant impact a ban</u> on <u>menthol cigarettes</u> can have on smoking rates, especially as menthols make up 40% of U.S cigarette sales.

Research

- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of
 Medicaid smokers who had previously enrolled in a
 Quitline and invited to re-engage by mail or
 telephone found that 9.3% did so within 90 days,
 compared to 6.3% of a randomly selected
 comparison group, with letters resulting in greater
 re-engagement than calls.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research systemic review of the Behavior Change Wheel intervention development process identified barriers/enablers to supporting smoking cessation within the domains of environmental context and resources (lack of staff time); knowledge (ill-informed interactions about smoking); social influences and intentions (lack of intention to deliver support).
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of data from U.S. civilian non-institutionalized adults who self-identified as Black and White and participated in the 1995-2019 Tobacco Use Supplement to the Current Population Survey concluded that education-related disparities in current cigarette smoking increased over time, especially among Black/African American male and female adults.
- A randomized, controlled study of 1,500 U.S. teen participants published in *JAMA Network*

Open and discovered that FDA's "The Real Cost" ads lowered the extent to which teens were open to vaping.
