State News

- The City of Baltimore in Maryland filed a <u>lawsuit</u> <u>against tobacco companies</u> for cleanup costs associated with cigarette filter waste.
- A Health Behavior Research analysis examining retailer compliance with carding before and after T21 as well as sales violations after T21 in New Jersey, found that although underage sales persisted, failure to card declined post T21 (81.3% to 69.4%), particularly for cigarettes.
- An analysis of weekly retail sales data (July 2015 through December 2019) published in *Tobacco Control* found that predicted average weekly flavored tobacco sales decreased by 96% from before comprehensive restriction on flavored tobacco sales in San Francisco, California to after enforcement, and to very low levels across all products, including cigars with concept-flavor names.

In the News

- Under a federal court order issued to take effect on Jan. 1, 2023, the major U.S. tobacco companies will soon have to post signs telling the public the truth about the deadly consequences of cigarette smoking at nearly 200,000 retail outlets across the nation that sell cigarettes.
- Tobacco companies are drumming up <u>opposition</u> to the FDA's proposed ban of menthol and flavored tobacco products by turning to gas station ads.

Research

- A randomized control trial published in Heart
 Rhythm concluded that rats exposed to tobacco or
 marijuana products exhibited progressively
 increased systolic blood pressure, decreased
 cardiac systolic function with chamber dilation, and
 reduced overall heart rate variability, relative to the
 clean air negative control group.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of FDA compliance checks of tobacco retailers with minor-involved inspections from 2015-2019 found that in 2017, 44.3% of zip codes with at least one tobacco retailer had no FDA underage sales inspections, with likelihood of having a retail violation of sales to minors higher in zip codes with a lower number of inspections and penalties and a higher number of violations in the previous two years.
- A Frontiers in Public Health analysis exploring the language used by British American Tobacco and Philip Morris International around harm, harm reduction, and terms used to refer to newer nicotine and tobacco products, highlighted overarching themes of individualization, normalization, and regulation, capturing how they use particular framings to downplay the role of

transnational tobacco companies in the perpetuation of population- and individual-level harms related to tobacco use.
