Definition for Overall Nicotine Use

Deadline: March 1

VA is curious if there is a definition for overall nicotine use. Do other states have a data element such as "nicotine use" where combustible tobacco products (cigarettes/cigars/hookah/pipes), e-cigarettes/vapes, as well as smokeless tobacco are combined? This would provide a more comprehensive view of overall nicotine use and dependence.

 new features.
- According to new Truth Initiative research published in <u>Frontiers in Public Health</u>, influencer content that promotes vaping on Instagram frequently <u>violates both federal</u> <u>advertising regulations and the social media</u> <u>platform's policies</u>.
- SelfMade Health Network released
 its Healthier Nation factsheets which can be
 used while developing or enhancing strategic
 partnerships with businesses, labor unions,
 "blue-collar" worksites, as well as others
 committed to reducing cancer and tobaccorelated disparities.
- ChangeLab Solutions created a new infographic and fact sheet, <u>Understanding</u> the Equitable Enforcement Ecosystem, to help policymakers develop equitable enforcement provisions and better understand the equitable enforcement ecosystem, particularly in the context of employment and labor standards.
- American Academy of
 Pediatrics announced its <u>newly developed</u>
 <u>case studies</u>, which demonstrate the
 effectiveness of the <u>"Ask Counsel Treat"</u>
 <u>cessation counseling model</u> across various
 pediatric ages and nicotine dependencies.
- Federal Trade Commission reported that for the first time ever, cigarette unit sales by the largest U.S. tobacco companies <u>dropped</u> <u>below 200 billion – a 70% decrease</u> from their high 40 years ago. While this is a step in the right direction, the absolute volume of

State News

- The following state news comes from **Hawaii**:
 - A bill was introduced in Hawaii that would raise the minimum legal age to purchase and possess tobacco products from 21 to 25.
 - A bill to subject e-cigarettes to the existing 70% wholesale tax on tobacco products, other than cigarettes, was introduced in Hawaii.
- The West Virginia legislature introduced a bill that would increase the cigarette pack tax by \$1.50 to \$2.70, with a parallel tax on other tobacco products.
- Tobacco and vape retailers have filed a lawsuit designed to stop Multnomah County, **Oregon** from enacting its ban on flavored tobacco and nicotine products next year.

<u>up" with menthol cigarettes</u>, from sharing a personal story to taking action on the community level.

Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of a 2022 online survey of current e-cigarette users found that those who viewed a tobacco-free nicotine message reported a higher intention to use tobacco-free than tobacco-derived nicotine vaping products and willingness to pay more for tobacco-free nicotine vaping products, compared to those who did not view a tobacco-free nicotine message.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of Wave 5
 Population Assessment of Tobacco and
 Health study data concluded that out of the 2,922 established e-cigarette users, 68.21%
 reported plans to quit vaping; 17.27% reported attempting to quit e-cigarettes in the past year; and 29.28% reported attempting to quit by cutting back in the past year.
- An analysis of NielsenIQ Retail Measurement
 Service data published in the American
 Journal of Preventive Medicine found that
 over-the-counter nicotine replacement therapy
 sales totaled about \$1 billion annually
 between
 2017 and 2020, as sales of gum and patches
 decreased, whereas lozenge sales increased
 across the study period.
- In a Tobacco Control analysis of six databases
 for original research examining the impacts or
 perceptions of 12 tobacco endgame policies
 among eight priority populations, 17-of-18
 included studies focused on the effectiveness
 or impacts of a very low nicotine content
 (VLNC) cigarette standard among people
