- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - On March 17, FDA issued marketing denial orders for two menthol ecigarette products marketed by R.J. Reynolds Vuse Vapor Company, citing the applications did not provide enough evidence that the marketing of these products would be appropriate for the protection of public health.
 - co Copenhagen Classic Snuff received authorization from FDA to be marketed as a modified risk tobacco product, allowing the smokeless product to market claims that it can reduce risk of lung cancer among smokers who switch completely to the product.
 - requirements for manufacturing, designing, packing, and storing of tobacco products to minimize and prevent contamination with foreign substances such as glass, metal, and plastics, and maintain consistency with e-liquid product labeling. A public oral hearing will be held on April 12 and public comments will be available for 180 days prior to the rulemaking.
 - A Tobacco Products Scientific
 Advisory Committee meeting will take place on May 18 to seek recommendations from FDA's outside panel of experts on the requirements presented in the proposed rule, during which the

support customized virtual programs focused on educating pediatric health clinicians and other collaborators on protecting the health of children and families by controlling tobacco smoke exposure. Only virtual programs leveraging traditional and nontraditional tobacco control programs and partnerships will be considered. Applicants are encouraged to join us for an application Q&A session on March 10, 2023, from 12-1 p.m. ET. <u>UpRISE Advocacy Burst Mini-</u> <u>Grant</u> – Center for Public Health Practice, Colorado School of Public Health

This program is offering a \$1,000 award (for approximately 10 hours of participation) to five youth-serving organizations and/or schools interested in advocacy, and who are willing to introduce youth to tobacco prevention work with a social justice lens.

- o FDA reported that it has made determinations on more than 99% of nearly 26 million tobacco products with applications submitted to FDA, including authorization of 23 new e-cigarette products and devices. FDA issued a refuse to accept (RTA) letter on Feb. 21 to an e-cigarette manufacturer associated with 17 million individual tobacco products.
- A new <u>webinar</u> outlines the process for manufacturers and vape shop owners to respond to warning letters for tobacco product manufacturer violations.
- The following announcements are from Truth Initiative:
 - Truth Initiative is raising alarms about tobacco imagery in entertainment media and popular culture, with research indicating that 37% of adolescents starting smoking because of smoking images seen in movies and youth heavily exposed to on-screen smoking had triple the risk to begin smoking or vaping.
 - A <u>report</u> published by Truth Initiative analyzes tobacco imagery appearing in popular streaming shows, movies, and music videos.
 - A <u>video</u> and <u>toolkit</u> were also released.
 - The number of e-cigarettes sold on the market between June 2021 and June 2022 <u>quadrupled from 453 to 2,023</u>, according to a Truth Initiative review of U.S. retail sales data.

State News

 The Alaska State Senate is considering bill SB 89, which would raise the minimum age to purchase tobacco and e-cigarettes from 19 to 21 and would place a point of sale tax on ecigarettes.

- The following state announcements are from Minnesota:
 - The U.S. Supreme Court granted
 <u>Edina, Minnesota motion to dismiss a challenge by R.J. Reynolds to ban flavored tobacco sales, following Los Angeles County's recent court challenge dismissal.</u>
 - The Minnesota case against Juul and Altria for their role in accelerating the vaping epidemic is scheduled for March 27, after the court rejected Juul's and Altria's request for the case to be dismissed on March 14.

In the News

 Altria exchanged <u>its entire investment</u> in Juul labs for heated tobacco intellectual property rights as a result of regulatory and legal challenges.

Research

- E-cigarette nicotine strengths sold in the U.S. have been trending upwards, according to a Nicotine & Tobacco Research study, which found monthly average nicotine strength increased from 2.5% to 4.4% over the five years.
- A recent study published in *Health Equity* found <u>flavored tobacco product use</u>

increased from 2019-2020 among youth across all racial/ethnic groups, with the largest increase observed among Hispanic youth (30.3%), who also had the highest susceptibility to future e-cigarette use (42.3%).

- A data brief from the CDC
 Foundation highlights trends in e-cigarette unit sales from January 2018 through December 2022, revealing significantly high increases in flavored product sales and use of among youth. A separate brief reviews these trends in specifically selected states.
- A Tobacco Control research article examines
 the relationship around discrimination, identity
 connectedness, and tobacco use among
 sexual and gender minority populations,
 finding that higher levels of discrimination
 were associated with polytobacco use.
