Outcomes Building Capacity to Reduce the Burden of Menthol and Other Flavored **Commercial Tobacco** Products in Communities that **Experience Health Disparities** - CDC **NCCDPHP** This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) seeks to advance health equity through strategic partnerships and community engagement by addressing disparities caused by menthol and other flavored tobacco product marketing and use. This collaboration will 1) promote and support social, economic and community change; 2) educate the public, community leaders, partners, and decision makers on policy, systems, and environmental changes that can prevent and reduce menthol tobacco use; 3) implement culturally appropriate interventions

The proposed structure would run at the state level and include both licensing and enforcement components. We estimate that we have between 11,500-12,000 retailers (which includes standalone vape shops). We are looking for help on structuring a budget with a high retailer density (including estimates for disposal and legal fees) and timelines for implementation. If any state/jurisdiction can help us, it would be greatly appreciated!

Do any states have experience with event sponsorships by tobacco product companies, particularly companies who manufacture/sell new "non-tobacco nicotine products" such as Zyn or L!X? Any insight you could provide would be much appreciated.

Partner Announcements

- The following announcements are from **CDC**:
 - A Preventing Chronic Disease analysis of trends in current cigarette smoking prevalence, population estimates, and relative disparity among U.S. adults using National Health Interview Survey data, found that from 2011 to 2020, linear decreases in prevalence and population estimates were observed for non-Hispanic White (20.6% to 13.3%), non-Hispanic Black (19.4% to 14.4%), and Hispanic (12.9% to 8.0%) adults.
 - O CDC released a new resource, Schools
 Supporting Students to Quit Tobacco Use as an
 Alternative to Suspension: Lessons from the
 Field, which provides resources and lessons
 from the field showcasing school districts across
 the country that are implementing tobacco
 prevention programs as an alternative to out-ofschool suspension for students who violate

- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - FDA announced that it had <u>issued warning</u>
 <u>letters to 30 retailers</u>, including one distributor, for illegally selling unauthorized tobacco products, specifically various types of Puff and Hyde disposable e-cigarettes, two of the most commonly reported brands used by youth e-cigarette users in 2022.
 - FDA <u>issued marketing denial orders to the firm</u>
 <u>Mothers Milk WTA</u> for more than 250 flavored
 and tobacco-flavored e-liquids.
 - FDA <u>issued marketing denial orders to 10</u>
 <u>companies</u>, which collectively manufacture and market approximately 6,500 flavored e-liquid and e-cigarette products. Flavors of some of the products denied include Citrus, Strawberry Cheesecake, Cool Mint, and Menthol.
 - FDA issued warning letters to firms responsible for two popular flavored, disposable e-cigarette products: Shenzen Innokin Technology Co. Ltd., who make Esco Bars products, and Breeze Smoke, LLC, who import and distribute Breeze products.
 - FDA issued an import alert for the disposable ecigarette brand Elf Bar to prevent their illegal tobacco products from entering the U.S. marketplace.
 - Center for Rapid Surveillance of Tobacco
 (CRST). Through rapid surveillance and reporting of information, CRST will enhance CTP and the research community's ability to understand, document, and quantify changes in the tobacco product marketplace and tobacco use patterns.
- The following announcements come from Truth Initiative:
 - Experts who run <u>This is Quitting</u>, a text message based quit-vaping program by Truth Initiative, <u>bust myths about mental health and</u> <u>quitting nicotine</u>.

- Truth Initiative outlines the <u>public health concern</u>
 of <u>oral nicotine pouches like Zyn</u>, including
 nicotine concentrations, regulations, and longterm health effects of nicotine pouches.
- The following announcements are from American Lung Association:
 - ALA released "National Landscape: State

 Policies for Coverage of Preventive Services and
 Tobacco Cessation Treatments," which outlines
 what state laws exist that require insurance
 coverage of preventive services and then
 specifically tobacco cessation. The resource
 found that while most states require coverage of
 some preventive services, only 14 states and
 Washington, D.C. require state regulated plans
 cover all USPSTF recommended preventive
 services.
 - ALA released "Coverage of Preventive Services without Cost-Sharing: Impact on Lung Cancer Screening & Opportunities for States," an issue brief summarizing current laws around preventive services coverage, the health and other benefits of covering preventive services without cost-sharing, and opportunities for states to protect and expand access to lung cancer screening and other preventive services at no cost.
- Researchers at The University of Rochester Medical Center are evaluating a text messaging program to quit vaping for Hispanic/Latino young adults (Español) and they are looking for participants. The intervention "Kick Vaping" was created with the help of Hispanic/Latino young adults to support assist their peers (18–25 years of age) on their quit journey with e-cigarettes. State News

- Washington State Governor Inslee signed SB 5365 into law to repeal penalties for minors who use, purchase, or possess vapor or tobacco products, offer communitybased interventions to help them quit tobacco use, and increase fines for retailers who sell tobacco products to minors.
- Governor Gianforte of Montana signed SB 122 into law to cap the cigar tax at the lesser of 50% of the wholesale price or 35 cents a cigar.
- The Board of Commissioners of Cook
 County, Illinois passed an ordinance to prohibit the sale
 of flavored liquid nicotine products.
- The Shreveport City Council voted to allow smoking once again in casinos, becoming the first municipality in Louisiana to withdraw smoke-free workplace protections.
- The Humboldt County Board of Supervisors in California unanimously passed a tobacco retailer licensing ordinance which requires a valid tobacco retailer's license to be obtained annually.

In the News

Canada has announced that it will begin <u>putting individual</u>
 <u>warning labels on cigarettes and other tobacco</u>
 <u>products</u> in an effort to further reduce their appeal,
 becoming the world's first country to use such a measure.

Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of survey data assessing knowledge of nicotine source in e-cigarettes and awareness of e-cigarettes containing synthetic nicotine concluded that most youth were either unsure (48.1%) or did not think (20.2%) that nicotine in e-cigarettes comes from tobacco plants; similarly, there was low-to-moderate awareness of e-cigarettes containing synthetic nicotine (28.7%), with higher awareness among youth who use ecigarettes (48.0%).
- An analysis of 2020 National Youth Tobacco Survey data
 published in the Journal of Adolescent Health found that
 among individuals who reported past 12-month visits to
 any healthcare professional, the odds of tobacco use
 screening were lower among males, middle schoolers,
 non-Hispanic Black, Hispanic, and Asian youth, compared
 to females, high schoolers, and non-Hispanic White
 youth.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis which identified all biomarkers of exposure and potential harm measured in heated tobacco products (HTP) trials found that of 16/82 biomarkers (seven exposure and nine potential harm), three of the exposure biomarkers significantly improved in smokers who switched to HTPs and the remaining 13 biomarkers did not improve – and in some instances worsening upon switching to HTPs – or were inconsistently affected across studies.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of cigarette tax scores from the Tobacconomics Cigarette Tax Scorecard and tobacco excise tax revenue information from WHO found that a one-point higher overall cigarette tax score is associated with higher tobacco excise tax revenue per capita of \$11.98 (in constant 2018 purchasing power parity international dollars) and for low and middle-income countries and lower performing countries at baseline, a one-point higher overall cigarette tax score is associated with higher tobacco excise tax revenue per capita of \$11.32 and \$6.92, respectively.
