- The HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health released a draft framework to support and accelerate smoking cessation, building on supports already in place for people who want to quit. HHS is seeking public input on the framework before it is finalized. The public comment period will close on July 30 at 11:59 p.m. ET.
- The following announcements are from **FDA**:
 - Brian King, director of FDA's Center for Tobacco Products (CTP), published a statement summarizing the center's progress addressing the evaluation of CTP by an independent expert panel facilitated by the Reagan-Udall Foundation. - The following announcements come from Truth Initiative:
 - Truth Initiative released its latest <u>Tobacco</u>

 Nation report, which analyzes geographic disparities in tobacco use, discusses the obstacles that limit tobacco policy change in these states, and proposes solutions to reduce geographic disparity in tobacco use across the United States.
 - Truth Initiative discussed the tobacco industry's history of targeting the LGBT community with youth activists gathered at the Capital Pride Festival.

State News

- Governor John Bel Edwards of Louisiana signed into law a bill that will increase the excise tax on ecigarettes from five cents per milliliter of nicotine solution to 15 cents and create a directory of all vape and alternative nicotine products authorized for sale in the state.
- An American Journal of Preventive Medicine analysis of male participants who registered with the Oklahoma Tobacco Helpline reporting dual use (smokeless tobacco and one additional combustible tobacco product), smokeless tobacco use only, and cigarette use only found that eight or more weeks of nicotine replacement therapy was associated with tobacco abstinence in men who reported dual use and exclusive smoking.

Research

- A probability-based panel study, published in *Tobacco Control*, concluded that most youth were either unsure (48.1%) or did not think (20.2%) that nicotine in e-cigarettes comes from tobacco plants. Similarly, most were unsure (48.2%) or did not think (8.1%) that nicotine in e-cigarettes comes from other sources and there was low-to-moderate awareness of e-cigarettes containing synthetic nicotine (28.7%), with higher awareness among youth who use e-cigarettes (48.0%).
- A randomized Tobacco Control analysis of U.S. adults who vaped or smoked concluded that all newly developed warning themes (e.g., metals exposure, DNA mutation, cardiovascular problems, chemical exposure, lung damage, impaired immunity, addiction) discouraged vaping more than the current FDA-required single addiction warning and led to greater negative affect, while the most discouraging warnings were about toxic metals exposure.
- In a recent systematic review published in the Journal of the American Heart
 Association, chronic exposure to low levels of lead, cadmium and arsenic, which are commonly used in commercial tobacco products causes an increased risk of cardiovascular disease.

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
