 On July 11–12, the TCN Executive Committee convened in-person for the TCN summer business meeting to strategize around the Network's priorities for the 2022– 2023 term, meet with the CDC Office on Smoking and Health, and receive updates from ASTHO staff on the national and state/territorial tobacco control landscape.

Partner Announcements

- ASTHO hosted a panel of experts who explored why states and other jurisdictions should consider endgame policies in their short- or long-term policy planning, what "tobacco endgame" means, whether endgame policies address health disparities and social determinants of health or exacerbate them, and what opportunities states and other jurisdictions can pursue to pass endgame policies or set the state to consider such policies in the future.
- A recent CDC Morbidity and Mortality Weekly
 Report highlighted that e-cigarette unit sales increased by
 46.6% during between January 2020 and December 2022.
 Additionally, sales of mint and other flavored prefilled cartridges ceased, and disposable e-cigarettes in fruit, sweet, and other flavors increased after January 2020.

Funding Opportunities

Tobacco/Vape-Free College **Grant** – Truth Initiative This program is offering up to \$20,000 to colleges and universities to support the adoption and implementation of a 100% tobacco- and vape-free campus policy. All colleges and universities that do not already have a 100% tobacco/vape-free policy are eligible to apply. Colleges that have smokeor tobacco-free policies that do not include e-cigarettes may still apply. To combat the vaping public health crisis, Truth Initiative is offering grants of up to \$10,000 to colleges to strengthen their 100% smoke or tobacco-free policies by adding ecigarettes. - FDA issued a marketing denial order (MDO) for myblu
 Menthol 2.4%, an e-cigarette product made by Fontem US,
 LLC (myblu). As a result, the company must not market or distribute this product in the United States, or they risk enforcement action by FDA.
- Starting July 1, major U.S. tobacco companies must begin to post eye-catching signs telling the public the truth about the deadly consequences of cigarette smoking at about 220,000 retail stores across the nation that sell cigarettes. Under a federal court order, the signs will be installed near cigarette displays in these stores between July 1 September 30 and must be displayed until June 30, 2025. A federal court order formalized the agreement in December.
- The following announcements are from Public Health Law
 Center:
 - O Public Health Law Center developed the <u>Flavored Tobacco Toolkit: Lessons Learned About Implementation of Flavored Policies</u> which includes lessons learned, best approaches from cities and states moving forward on flavored policies, a literature review evaluating the effectiveness of flavored tobacco sales restrictions, and a comprehensive guide on the best approaches for implementation.
 - Public Health Law Center released updated resources which summarizes results of a 50-state scan of state laws requiring that behavioral health facilities have tobacco-free grounds and include tobacco dependency treatment in their clinical practice.
- The following announcements are from **Truth Initiative**:
 - Truth Initiative released an in-depth policy report, Gamechanger: Shifting from Tobacco
 Control to Ending the Industry's Influence for
 Good which provides a thorough analysis of the potential of the "tobacco endgame" and recommendations on how the public health community can collaborate to accelerate progress toward a commercial tobacco-free future.

State News

- Governor Mike DeWine has again <u>vetoed an effort by</u>
 <u>legislators to prevent Ohio cities</u> from regulating the sale of
 tobacco and other nicotine products and is again asking for
 a statewide flavored tobacco ban.
- A mixed methods analysis published in International
 Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health to
 describe tobacco practices and the desire for training
 among community health workers (CHWs) in
 Chicago, Illinois found that 73.3% of CHWs reported
 discussing tobacco use during visits, but fewer reported
 that they had provided cessation advice (43%) or
 intervened directly (9%).
- A Tobacco Control analysis of 2014-2019 California Health Interview Survey data concluded that among respondents aged 18–64 who lived in lowincome (<200% of the Federal Poverty Level) households, 6.4% identified as current e-cigarette and 43.0% reported food insecurity, with food insecurity being significantly more likely to be reported among current ecigarette users compared with never e-cigarette users.

Research

- A randomized clinical trial analysis published in JAMA Network found that for participants engaging in a 12-week course of cytisinicline vs. placebo, continuous abstinence rates were 32.6% vs 7.0% for weeks 9 to 12 and 21.1% vs. 4.8% during weeks 9 to 24.
- A Tobacco Control analysis which investigated public interest in shopping and point-of-sales (POS) of JUUL and Puff Bar products found that after the Trump administration announced its plans to ban flavored e-cigarettes and JUUL Labs, Inc.'s decided to suspend the sales of its sweet and fruity flavored products, <u>JUUL's shopping interest relative</u> <u>search volume (RSV) from Google search queries and</u> <u>sales declined</u> while Puff Bar's shopping interest RSV peaked, and its sales increased.
- A Tobacco Control analysis concluded that addiction, chemicals, negative health symptoms and effects, and cigarette comparison themes in vaping prevention ads were associated with higher perceived message effectiveness (PME), as were graphic images and warning symbols. Industry targeting, environmental impact, flavor themes, images of food and people's faces were associated with lower PME, as were hashtags, statistics, and first-person language or the word 'teen'.

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
