Partner Announcements

- According to a recent CDC Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, the number of cases of <u>vape</u> <u>product-related poisonings has doubled since 2018</u>, with the majority of cases being in kids under the age of five.
- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - FDA issued warning letters to three distributors—ABS Distributions, Inc.; EC Supply, Inc.; and Easy Wholesale, LLC for selling and/or distributing multiple unauthorized e-cigarette products including Elf Bar/EB Design, Esco Bars, and Puff Max.
 - Accidental exposure to nicotine-containing e-liquids can <u>cause injury and even death</u> <u>in children</u>, making it important to keep these products away from kids and be prepared in case of accidental ingestion or other emergencies due to unintended exposure.
 - The FDA Center for Tobacco
 Products <u>announced that the center will</u>
 <u>host a virtual listening session</u> on Aug. 22,.
 During this listening session, CTP is
 requesting feedback on the development
 of a new five-year strategic plan for the
 center, including proposed strategic goals.
 The public can also submit electronic or
 written comments to the <u>Federal Register</u>
 <u>notice</u> by Aug. 29.

Funding Opportunities

Tobacco/Vape-Free College Grant – Truth Initiative This program is offering up to \$20,000 to colleges and universities to support the adoption and implementation of a 100% tobacco- and vapefree campus policy. All colleges and universities that do not already have a 100% tobacco/vape-free policy are eligible to apply.

Colleges that have smoke- or tobacco-free policies that do not include e-cigarettes may still apply. To combat the vaping public health crisis, Truth Initiative is offering grants of up to \$10,000 to colleges to strengthen their 100% smoke or tobacco-free policies by adding e-cigarettes. Public Health Communication Messaging about the Continuum of Risk for Tobacco Products – NIH

This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) invites applications for a Cooperative Agreement (U01) that will utilize health communication research to better understand the impact that messaging about the continuum of risk for tobacco products may have on various segments of the population. - Comments on the <u>"Requirements for</u> <u>Tobacco Product Manufacturing</u> <u>Practice"</u> proposed rule must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. ET on September 6. The proposed rule, if finalized, lays out FDA's requirements for tobacco product manufacturers regarding the manufacture, design, packing, and storage of tobacco products.
- ChangeLab Solutions released Policy Process Evaluation for Equity, an online tool with information intended to inspire conversation and new considerations among changemakers who are developing evaluation provisions and plans in policies to promote health equity.
- The following announcements are from **Truth** Initiative:
 - A growing body of Truth Initiative research, much of it focused on misinformation surrounding nicotine, suggests that the tobacco industry is using social media platforms popular with young people to advertise tobacco products, control tobacco-related conversations, evade flavored tobacco restrictions, and spread misinformation about nicotine.
 - Truth Initiative's latest Impact Series, "Gamechanger: Shifting from tobacco control to ending the industry's influence for good," <u>discussed the potential of the</u> <u>endgame movement and strategies</u> to move to a time when commercial tobacco and nicotine are no longer used.
 - The EX Program highlights that <u>cigarette</u> <u>smoking is a main driver of the differences</u> <u>in survival rates</u> between people with HIV and people without HIV.
 - In a recent blog, EX program discusses <u>how to combat the lethal</u> <u>combination</u> of loneliness and smoking.

State News

 The Oklahoma House voted to override Governor Kevin Stitt's veto of a bill that extends agreements on selling tobacco for another year, now allowing any tribe with an existing agreement on tobacco sales to extend the terms of that agreement until Dec. 31, 2024.

In the News

- Reuters reports that in JUUL Labs' latest premarket tobacco product application submitted to the FDA on July 18, Juul Labs said it was seeking to sell tobacco-flavored pods at a nicotine concentration of less than 2%.
- A new World Health Organization report highlights that 5.6 billion people, <u>71% of the world's</u> <u>population, are now protected with at least one</u> <u>tobacco control measure</u> to help save lives from deadly tobacco—five times more than in 2007.

attitudes toward smoking rules <u>found that although</u> <u>most multiunit housing (MUH) residents who</u> <u>currently smoked lived in privately rented (66.9%)</u> <u>or privately owned (17.6%) housing</u>, a substantial proportion (15.5%) lived in publicly sponsored housing.

- A Tobacco Control analysis of Population Assessment on Tobacco and Health Study data concluded that, upon adjusting for sociodemographic variables, <u>respondents who</u> <u>received a coupon were found to be more likely to</u> <u>initiate established cigarette smoking</u> at follow-up.
- An RCT published in *Nicotine & Tobacco Research* found that <u>varenicline resulted in the</u> highest Week 12 abstinence rates across all pharmacotherapies and compared to placebo in all comorbidity subgroups: cardiac, respiratory, vascular, and diabetes. This was maintained at Week 24 for those with cardiac, vascular, and diabetes comorbidities.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis using data from Truth Initiative's flavor policy database and NielsenIQ retailer scanners for California, Illinois, Massachusetts, and New York found that a <u>25%</u> increase in the percentage of the population covered by a flavored cigar sales restriction was associated with a decrease in per capita all cigar sales of 15%–19%.
