- The following announcements are from the FDA:
 - FDA issued complaints for civil money penalties (CMPs) <u>against 22 retailers</u> for the illegal sale of Elf Bar/EB Design ecigarettes, a popular youth-appealing brand.
 - As part of efforts from FDA's Center for Tobacco Products (CTP) to continue providing resources to help applicants navigate the FDA's premarket tobacco product application (PMTA) process, CTP launched the Product Form Validator Tool for Form FDA 4057b, "Premarket Tobacco Product Application Grouping Spreadsheet." This voluntary new tool allows applicants to verify the data in their required Form FDA 4057b and pinpoint any necessary corrections before submitting.

Tobacco/Vape-Free College **Grant** - Truth Initiative This program is offering up to \$20,000 to colleges and universities to support the adoption and implementation of a 100% tobacco- and vapefree campus policy. All colleges and universities that do not already have a 100% tobacco/vape-free policy are eligible to apply. Colleges that have smoke- or tobacco-free policies that do not include e-cigarettes may still apply. To combat the vaping public health crisis, Truth Initiative is offering grants of up to \$10,000 to colleges to strengthen their 100% smoke or tobacco-free policies by adding e-cigarettes. Deadline: Oct. 12, 5 p.m. ET

This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) invites applications for a Cooperative Agreement (U01) that will utilize health communication research to better understand the impact that messaging about the continuum of risk for tobacco products may have on various segments of the population. Applications should consider effects on audiences for whom the messaging could potentially be useful (i.e., adults who use combustible products) and on those for whom the messaging could have negative consequences (e.g., youth).

In the News

 A Washington Post article discusses a new study in <u>Addiction</u> that suggests that <u>tobacco companies</u>, <u>who were skilled at marketing cigarettes</u>, used similar strategies to hook people on processed foods.

Research

- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of cross-sectional web-based survey data found that Zyn (27%) and Lucy (19%) were the most currently used oral nicotine pouch brands with mint (23%) and tobacco (16%) as the most currently used flavors, while the availability of preferred flavors was the most frequently reported motivation for use of oral nicotine pouches.
- An analysis of 2015–2019 Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System data, published in *Preventive Medicine*, found that <u>Hispanic adolescents had lower odds of e-cigarette use than White adolescents</u> in Texas. Comparatively, in the United States, male gender, previous combustible and substance use, and depression were associated with higher odds of ever using e-cigarettes, while current use was associated with several factors including age and White race.


About the Tobacco Control Network
