The funding recipients include: American Heart Association, Inc.; Chicago Department of Public Health; Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc.; Leadership Council for Healthy Communities, Inc.; Learn to Grow, Inc.; Oregon Health Authority; Public Health Division; Rhode Island Department of Health; and University of Kentucky Research Foundation.

 - o FDA issued warning letters to 15 online retailers and three manufacturers and/or distributors for selling or distributing unauthorized e-cigarette products. The warning letters cite a range of popular and youth-appealing e-cigarette products, including disposable products, marketed under the brand names Elf Bar, EB Design, Lava, Cali, Bang, and Kangertech.

Funding Opportunities

Tobacco/Vape-Free College Grant – Truth Initiative This program is offering up to \$20,000 to colleges and Assessment of Tobacco and Health (PATH) Study, which contain questionnaire data collected between March 2021 and November 2021. In addition, Wave 5.5 Ever/Never Special Collection Public-Use Files (SCPUF) are now available along with updated Master Linkage Files.

- The following announcements are from Truth Initiative:
 - Truth Initiative launched Prescription Drug Safety: Know the truth, a free digital course from the nationally recognized, evidence-based youth tobacco and opioid prevention truth® campaign and the leading social impact education innovator EVERFI.
 - The EX Program highlights the interplay between nicotine and alcohol and how this can have a major effect on an individual's ability to quit either substance and stay quit.
- The Community Preventive Services Task
 Force recommends family-based interventions to prevent substance use in a recent systematic review.

State News

- District Attorney of Alameda
 County, California announced her office
 had obtained a temporary restraining order against
 a Livermore-based company for selling illegal
 flavored tobacco and synthetic cannabis to minors.
- The city council of Grandview
 Heights, Ohio passed an ordinance to prohibit the sale of flavored tobacco products.

universities to support the adoption and implementation of a 100% tobacco- and vapefree campus policy. All colleges and universities that do not already have a 100% tobacco/vape-free policy are eligible to apply. Colleges that have smoke- or tobacco-free policies that do not include e-cigarettes may still apply. To combat the vaping public health crisis, Truth Initiative is offering grants of up to \$10,000 to colleges to strengthen their 100% smoke or tobacco-free policies by adding e-cigarettes.

Public Health Communication Messaging about the Continuum of Risk for Tobacco Products - NIH This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) invites applications for a Cooperative Agreement (U01) that will utilize health communication research to better understand the impact that messaging about the continuum of risk for tobacco products may have on various segments of the population. Applications should consider effects on audiences for whom the messaging could potentially be useful (i.e., adults who use combustible products) and on those for whom the messaging could have negative consequences (e.g., youth).

Job Listings

- An Oregon circuit court judge <u>ruled in favor of</u>
 <u>Multnomah County's flavored tobacco product law</u>,
 stating state law doesn't prevent the county—acting
 as the local public health authority—from passing
 ordinances regulating the sale of flavored tobacco
 products.
- New York Governor Kathy Hochul signed public health legislation—A1025/S50—which will make tobacco products less accessible by prohibiting the sale of these products at vending stands and in vending machines in state buildings.

Research

- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research analysis of
 National Youth Tobacco Survey data from 2018 to
 2021 concluded that only 24.5% of youth aged 10–
 17 were exposed to FDA e-cigarette warnings, with
 White youth more likely to be exposed than
 Hispanic and non-Hispanic Black youth.
- An analysis of attitudes around graphic health warnings published in *Preventive Medicine Reports* found that support for such laws <u>varied by</u> <u>several demographic factors</u>, including age, gender, educational attainment, and current smoking status.
- A data analysis published in *PLOS One* concluded that the use of tobacco and/or cannabis products was associated with greater odds of self-reported anxiety and depression between 2020 and 2022, with the greatest odds among the co-use group.


About the Tobacco Control Network
